Report of the Advisory Committee on Administrative  
and Budgetary Questions

1. The Advisory Committee on Administrative and Budgetary Questions wishes to draw the attention of the Fifth Committee to a letter from the Controller dated 19 March 1996, on the financing of the above missions. The text of the Controller's letter and additional information provided to the Advisory Committee during its deliberations on the matter are contained in the annex to the present report.
2. In his letter, the Controller recalls that the General Assembly, by its decision 50/410 B of 23 December 1995, authorized the Secretary-General to enter into commitments for the operations in the former Yugoslavia for the period from 1 January to 31 March 1996 in the amount of \$100 million and to assess an amount of \$89.4 million.

With regard to the period beyond 31 March 1996, the Advisory Committee understands that the report of the Secretary-General on the financing of the United Nations Peace Forces (UNPF), the United Nations Mission in Bosnia and Herzegovina (UNMIBH), the United Nations Transitional Administration in Eastern Slavonia, Baranja and Western Sirmium (UNTAES) and the United Nations Preventive

Deployment Force (UNPREDEP) for the period from 1 January to 30 June 1996 is expected to be issued on 27 March 1996, i.e., four days before the expiration of the current financial authority granted by the General Assembly. The Committee points out that it will not be possible for it to consider the report of the Secretary-General in detail and to produce its report in such a short period of time.

4. Under the circumstances, the Controller, in his letter of 19 March 1996, requests that additional commitment in the amount of \$140.1 million gross and an assessment in the amount of \$150.7 million gross be authorized for the period through 31 May 1996. Detailed information relating to the requested additional commitment of \$140.1 million and additional assessment of \$150.7 million is provided in the annex to the present report.

5. The Advisory Committee was informed, upon request, that the cost estimates of \$490.3 million gross for the period from 1 January to 30 June 1996 reflect, to a large degree, the anticipated schedule of deployment of military and civilian personnel. The Committee points out, in this connection, that there are currently some uncertainties with regard to the deployment of personnel which will affect the cost estimates.

Furthermore, the Advisory Committee was informed of the unencumbered balance of about \$230 million resulting from the termination of the mandate of the United Nations Protection Force (UNPROFOR) on 20 December 1995. However, it is not clear to the Committee, at this stage, what impact the balance will have on the cost estimates for the period under consideration.

7. The Advisory Committee requested information regarding the value of infrastructure, equipment and assets transferred from UNPROFOR to the Implementation Force (IFOR). The Committee was informed that the sale of UNPF assets to IFOR has to date resulted in the amount of \$3.2 million.

Under the circumstances and pending its detailed consideration of the report of the Secretary-General on the financing of UNPF, UNMIBH, UNTAES and UNPREDEP, the Advisory Committee recommends that the General Assembly authorize, at this stage, additional commitments in the amount of \$100 million gross for the period from 1 January to 31 May 1996 for the financing of UNPF, UNMIBH, UNTAES and UNPREDEP. Should the General Assembly decide on assessment, the Committee points out that the Secretary-General has requested an additional assessment of \$150.7 million for the period through 31 May 1996.

9. The Advisory Committee points out that its recommendation with regard to the commitment authority of \$100 million gross does not constitute the Committee's acceptance of any part of the budget proposal relating to the financing of UNPF, UNMIBH, UNTAES and UNPREDEP, which will be considered in detail by the Advisory Committee at a later stage during the fiftieth session of the General Assembly, as mentioned above.
