The Fifth Committee,

Having considered draft resolution A/50/L.68, the statement on programme budget implications submitted by the Secretary-General, 1/ the recommendations of the Advisory Committee on Administrative and Budgetary Questions, 2/ the letter dated 12 March 1996 from the Secretary-General to the President of the General Assembly 3/ and the letter dated 14 March 1996 from the President of the General Assembly to the Chairman of the Fifth Committee, 4/

Recalling that the General Assembly, in its resolution 50/214 of 23 December 1995, already requested the Secretary-General to make economies for an amount of 103,991,200 dollars and also requested the Secretary-General to fully implement all mandated programmes and activities,

Reaffirming the budgetary process adopted in resolution 41/213 of 19 December 1986 and subsequent relevant resolutions,

Decides to inform the General Assembly that, should it adopt draft resolution A/50/L.68, the Secretary-General would be authorized to enter into commitments in an amount not exceeding a monthly level of 2,329,700 dollars (net of staff assessment) should the mandate of the mission be extended beyond 31 March 1996;

Requests the Secretary-General to submit to the General Assembly through the Advisory Committee on Administrative and Budgetary Questions, not later than 15 May 1996, proposals on possible means of absorption in the 1996-1997 programme budget, including, inter alia, in part II thereof;

Decides to revert to the issue of appropriations at its resumed session, in May 1996, in the light of the Secretary-General's proposals requested herein.
