Addendum

Pursuant to rule 11 of the provisional rules of procedure of the Security Council, the Secretary-General is submitting the following summary statement.

The complete list of items of which the Security Council is seized is contained in document S/11935 of 5 January 1976 and the pertinent addenda. During the week ending 9 October 1976, the Security Council took action on the following item:

The Security Council continued its consideration of the item at its 1959th and 1960th meetings, held on 5 and 7 October 1976. During the course of the meetings, in addition to the representatives invited previously, the President, with the consent of the Council, invited the representatives of Burundi, Ethiopia, Niger, Poland, Somalia and Sri Lanka, at their request, to participate in the discussion without the right to vote.
