II. ANNOTATIONS TO THE PROVISIONAL AGENDA

Item 1: Opening of the fourth part of the Conference

The fourth part of the Conference will be opened by the Secretary-General of UNCTAD or his representative on 28 March 1996.

Item 3: Credentials of representatives

The credentials of representatives and the names of alternate representatives and advisers shall be submitted to the Secretary-General of UNCTAD as early as possible.

In accordance with rule 4 of its rules of procedure, the United Nations Conference on Natural Rubber, 1994, at its second plenary meeting held on 6 April 1994, appointed a Credentials Committee consisting of the representatives of China, Indonesia, Nigeria, United Kingdom of Great Britain and Northern Ireland and the United States of America. The Credentials Committee may wish to verify the credentials of participants in the fourth part of the Conference.

Item 4: Consideration of the possible extension of the period of signature in article 57 of the International Natural Rubber Agreement, 1995

In a letter dated 13 February 1996, addressed to the Secretary-General of UNCTAD, the Executive Director of the International Natural Rubber Organization conveyed the wish of the Chairman and members of the present International Natural Rubber Council to reconvene the United Nations Conference on Natural Rubber, 1994 for one day as early as possible for the sole purpose of modifying the period of signature as contained in article 57 of the International Natural Rubber Agreement, 1995.
