### **The question concerning Haiti**

#### **Report of the Secretary-General on the United Nations Support Mission in Haiti (S/1996/813 and Add.1\*)**

**The President:** The Security Council will now begin its consideration of the item on its agenda.

The Security Council is meeting in accordance with the understanding reached in its prior consultations.

Members of the Council have before them the report of the Secretary-General on the United Nations Support Mission in Haiti, contained in documents S/1996/813 and S/1996/813/Add.1\*. Members of the Council also have before them document S/1996/990, which contains the text of a draft resolution prepared in the course of the Council's prior consultations.

I should like to draw the attention of the members of the Council to document S/1996/956, which contains the text of a letter dated 15 November 1996 from the

Secretary-General addressed to the President of the Security Council, transmitting the text of a letter dated 13 November 1996 from the President of Haiti addressed to the Secretary-General.

It is my understanding that the Security Council is ready to proceed to the vote on the draft resolution (S/1996/990) before it. If I hear no objection, I shall put the draft resolution to the vote now.

There being no objection, it is so decided.

**The President:** There were 15 votes in favour. The draft resolution has been adopted unanimously as resolution 1085 (1996).
