Annex

Decision No. 176 of 26 June 1997 adopted by the Permanent Council  
of the Organization for Security and Cooperation in Europe

The Permanent Council decides to:

Pursue OSCE tasks in the Republic of Croatia on the basis of Permanent Council Decision No. 112 of 18 April 1996, as amended by this decision;

Reaffirm the availability of all OSCE institutions to assist in the development of democratic institutions, processes and mechanisms;

Authorize the Mission:

- To assist with and to monitor implementation of Croatian legislation and agreements and commitments entered into by the Croatian Government on:
  - Two-way return of all refugees and displaced persons and on protection of their rights, and
  - The protection of persons belonging to national minorities;
- To make specific recommendations to the Croatian authorities and refer, as appropriate, urgent issues to the Permanent Council;

Build up Mission personnel, starting in July 1997, to a calling of 250 expatriates with a view to full deployment by 15 January 1998. The personnel will be deployed by decision of the Head of Mission;

Extend the mandate of the reinforced OSCE Mission for a period until 31 December 1998. Prolongation and changes of mandate will be subject to a new decision by the Permanent Council.

The Permanent Council takes note of the agreement between the Croatian authorities and the Chairman-in-Office to consider this decision as having the effect of amending the Memorandum of Understanding concluded between the Government of Croatia and the OSCE.
