QUESTIONS TO BE DISCUSSED WITH THE REPRESENTATIVES OF SPECIALIZED
AGENCIES ON THE OCCASION OF THE FIRST PRELIMINARY CONTACT
BETWEEN THEM AND THE TEMPORARY TRANSPORT AND COMMUNICATIONS
COMMISSION

 - (a) Reciprocal representation
 - (b) Exchange of information and documents
 - (c) Participation in the Co-ordination Commission of the Economic and Social Council, if created.
 - (d) Recommendations to the specialized agencies by the General Assembly and the Economic and Social Council.
 - (e) Reports by the specialized agencies to the Economic and Social Council.
 - (f) Decisions of the Security Council.
 - (g) Assistance to the Trusteeship Council.
 - (h) Requests for advisory opinions of the International Court of Justice.
 - (i) Requests for information by the Court.
 - (j) Budgetary and financial relationships.
 - (k) Permanent liaison officers.
 - (l) Proposal of agenda items.
 - (m) Rules of Procedure.

- (o) Personnel arrangements.
- (p) Privileges and immunities.
- (q) Administrative tribunal.
- (r) Technical services.
- (s) Central statistical service.
- (t) Location of headquarters.

2. Ascertain if an amendment of the statutes (constitution) of the specialized agencies concerned would be necessary in connection with the putting into practice of the measures enumerated herebefore, and if so:

- (a) How and by whom these amendments could be carried out, and what is the existing machinery for these purposes.
- (b) When these amendments could be affectuated.

3. What inter-agency arrangements, if any, have they concluded, and with whom; and what is their nature.

4. What are substantive problems requiring immediate attention, which might exist in their fields of action.

5. Their suggestions as to the possible relationships between them and the more restricted international organizations in their respective fields. (For instance that of PICAO in respect to CITEJA).

In the particular case of ECITO, this last point should be altered, taking into account the special character of this organization. It could be as follows:

What are ECITO's present and envisaged future relations with:

- (a) Regional organizations of a restricted character covering only one of the fields which ECITO is concerned with.
- (b) Organizations of higher (world-wide) degree, which might be created in the sphere of activity of ECITO.

Further, ECITO should be asked for suggestions covering its scope and functions in case it becomes a permanent organization.
