### PLENARY

#### 1st meeting

#### Opening of the session

The Chairman made an opening statement.

#### Organizational matters [1]

##### (a) Adoption of the agenda

The Executive Secretary of the INC/FCCC Secretariat made an introductory statement.

The Committee adopted the provisional agenda as contained in document A/AC.237/56.

##### (b) Organization of work

The Chairman made a statement.

The Committee approved its organization of work as contained in Annex II to document A/AC.237/56.

Statements were made by the Executive Director of UNEP, the Chairman of the WMO/UNEP Intergovernmental Panel on Climate Change and the Chief Executive Officer and Chairman of the Global Environment Facility.

#### Status of Ratification of the Convention [2]

The Executive Secretary of the INC/FCCC Secretariat made an introductory statement.

Statements were made by the representatives of Algeria (on behalf of the Group of 77 and China), South Africa, the Russian Federation, Saudi Arabia, Uruguay, Nigeria, Kenya, Papua New Guinea, Indonesia and Lesotho.

The Committee thus concluded its consideration of the item.

## WORKING GROUP I

### 1st meeting

The Co-Chairman made an opening statement.

### Organization of work

After statements by the representatives of Malaysia and the United States, the Working Group approved its programme of work, as orally amended.

### Matters relating to commitments [3]

The Chairman of the WMO/UNEP Intergovernmental Panel on Climate Change (IPCC) made a statement followed by a brief question and answer period in which questions were posed by the representatives of Saudi Arabia, Nauru, Argentina, Malaysia, Benin, Brazil, Samoa, Uruguay, Hungary, Mauritius, Kenya and South Africa.

### First review of information communicated by each Party included in Annex 1 to the Convention [3(a)]

The Working Group began its consideration of the item and heard an introductory statement by a representative of the Secretariat.

Statements were made by the representatives of Canada, Czech Republic, Nauru, the United States, Japan, Germany (on behalf of the European Community), Poland, Kenya and Brazil.

## WORKING GROUP II

### 1st meeting

The Co-Chairman made an opening statement.

### Organization of work

After statements by the United States and Canada, the Working Group approved its programme of work as orally amended.

### Questions to the Chief Executive Officer/Chairman of the Global Environment Facility (GEF)

The Chief Executive Officer/Chairman of the GEF responded to questions from the representatives of Germany (on behalf of the European Community), Antigua and Barbuda, Argentina, Peru, Brazil, United States, China, United Republic of Tanzania, Kenya, Colombia, Saudi Arabia, United Kingdom and the Russian Federation, as well as from the observer for the Environmental Defense Fund, a non-governmental organization.
