COMMUNICATION FROM MR. PAUL WAMBA KUDILILWA
CONCERNING TANGANYIKA

Note by the Secretary-General: In accordance with rule 24 and supplementary rule F of the rules of procedure for the Trusteeship Council and in accordance with paragraphs 9 and 10 of the Report of the Committee on Examination of Petitions (T/L.243 and Corr.1) approved by the Trusteeship Council at its 397th meeting, on 13 March 1952, the Secretary-General has the honour to transmit to the members of the Trusteeship Council and to the Government of Italy as the Administering Authority for the Trust Territory of Somaliland, a communication dated 11 August 1952 from Mr. Paul Wamba Kudililwa, concerning the Trust Territory of Tanganyika.

Sir,

Your last letter Ref. No. TRI 130/5/06 of 1.10.51.

I have the honour to send you a reminder to my letter and previous correspondence regarding my case.^{1/}

2. I shall be very grateful, with the kind permission of your Trusteeship Council if this case of mine could be examined at the spot but not by the Visiting Mission or Missions but would request very seriously that the Council should appoint a Commission of Enquiry to my case or other Chiefs' cases which have just been hidden in the enclosed curtains. I would like to point out that, as it is now it is very hard for the Trusteeship Council to judge the case while they are away from the Territory, and that the Council is being one sided because of taking a decision from my opponent. I would again point out that, in order that the Council may achieve its purposes it should act in the way the Judge acts in the Court, in which case the witnesses, defending parties appear before the Court.

3. Or again I should suggest that now that the United Nations Trusteeship Council has failed to judge my case rightly, I would prefer the case being taken into the International High Court, as I see and foresee that as long as

the Administering Authority is with you all the time no useful purposes would be reached within the near future.

4. With all the hope of the International Justice in this World my case will receive a very careful attention and that either of the above requests could be fulfilled.
