THE CAMEROONS UNDER BRITISH ADMINISTRATION

Sir,

We the central Executive Members representing the Bamelike people in the S. Cameroons have to confirm our stand on Secession from the Federation of Nigeria, and to continue under a modified Trustyship Agreement for short time, while working hard for our Independence. That the question of re-unification is a domestic matter. That we endorse your stand for the restriction of the franchise to the indengineous British Cameroonians only. That we urge you insist and stand firmly by this opinion and save the Southern Cameroons from the Communist Organization of O.K. who is out to blacken our good relationship with your good Government and the native of the Southern Cameroons. We beg your God Guidance to fight hard and bring home to us the Secession question which is the only wish of the majority of the Southern Cameroons.
