ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT OF UNDER-DEVELOPED COUNTRIES

Brazil, Italy, Mexico, Pakistan and Peru:
joint draft resolution

The General Assembly,

Considering that there is a close relationship between economic and population problems, especially with regard to countries which are in the process of economic development,

Bearing in mind the General Assembly and Economic and Social Council resolutions which refer to the relations existing between economic development and social change,

Recalling that international co-operation towards economic development will be more effective when more is known about the population changes that accompany such development,

1. Invites Member States to follow as closely as possible the inter-relationship existing between economic and population changes, especially in the case of countries which are in the process of economic development;

2. Invites the attention of the Economic and Social Council and of the specialized agencies concerned to the growing importance of this question;

3. Asks the Secretary-General to continue his policy of co-ordination in the economic and population fields, particularly with reference to countries which are in the process of economic development;

4. Invites the Economic and Social Council, when preparing its report to the General Assembly, to include in the chapter on economic development the pertinent information which refers to the Economic and Social Council activities in the field of population.
