Appointments to fill vacancies in subsidiary organs and other appointments

Appointment of members of the Joint Inspection Unit

Note by the President of the General Assembly

1. As indicated in paragraph 6 of the note by the Secretary-General of 29 September 2021 ([A/76/365](#)), the General Assembly is required, during its current session, to appoint four members of the Joint Inspection Unit to fill the vacancies that will arise from the expiration on 31 December 2022 of the term of office of Gopinathan Achamkulangare (India), Jean Wesley Cazeau (Haiti), Nikolay Lozinskiy (Russian Federation) and Sukai Prom-Jackson (Gambia).
2. In accordance with the procedures described in article 3, paragraph 1, of the statute of the Joint Inspection Unit and with General Assembly resolution [61/238](#), the President of the General Assembly, at the 30th plenary meeting, held on 11 November 2021, having held the necessary consultations, and on the basis of the candidates submitted by the African States, the Asia-Pacific States, the Eastern European States and the Latin American and Caribbean States, requested Antigua and Barbuda, Botswana, Iraq and the Russian Federation to propose candidates (see annexes I to IV) to serve for a period of five years beginning on 1 January 2023.
3. The candidates, in accordance with paragraph 7 of General Assembly resolution [59/267](#), should have experience in at least one of the following fields: oversight, audit, inspection, investigation, evaluation, finance, project evaluation, programme evaluation, human resources management, management, public administration, monitoring and/or programme performance, as well as knowledge of the United Nations system and its role in international relations.
4. The President of the General Assembly has held the consultations described in article 3, paragraph 2, of the statute of the Joint Inspection Unit, including consultations with the President of the Economic and Social Council and with the Secretary-General in his capacity as Chair of the United Nations System Chief Executives Board for Coordination. The replies received from the President of the Council and from the Secretary-General to the identical letters dated 1 December 2021 addressed to them from the President of the Assembly are annexed to the present note (see annexes V and VI).



5. Having completed the required consultations, the President of the General Assembly has the honour to present to the Assembly the following candidates for appointment as members of the Joint Inspection Unit for a five-year term beginning on 1 January 2023 and expiring on 31 December 2027:
