The following letter has been sent by the Personal Representative of
the Secretary-General to the Representative of the United Kingdom:

Dear Sir:

I have the honour to inform you that the United Nations Special Committee on Palestine, after careful consideration of the problem of its relations with representatives of the Mandatory Power and of the population of Palestine, adopted on 3 June at its third meeting the following rule of procedure:

"The Mandatory Power, the Arab Higher Committee, and the Jewish Agency for Palestine may appoint liaison officers to the Committee who shall supply such information or render such other assistance as the Committee may require. The liaison officers may, suo motu, present at the discretion of the Committee such information as they may think advisable".

I would appreciate it if you would inform me at an early date of the name of the Liaison Officer of the United Kingdom, if it may wish to designate such an officer.
