PETITIONS CIRCULATED UNDER RULE 85 AND COMMUNICATIONS

Draft 267th Report of the Standing Committee on Petitions

Chairman: Mr. John G. BACON (United States)

1. The Standing Committee on Petitions, composed of the representatives of Belgium, China, India, the Union of Soviet Socialist Republics, the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Northern Ireland and the United States of America, has, in accordance with paragraph 8 of the annex to Trusteeship Council resolution 1713 (XX) and paragraphs 3 and 5 of rule 90 of the rules of procedure of the Trusteeship Council, considered at its 557th meeting the thirtieth report of the Committee on Classification of Communications contained in document T/C.2/L.445.
2. This report covered thirty-seven communications contained in the under-mentioned documents which were provisionally classified by the Committee on Classification of Communications as follows:
