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UNITED NATIONS CONFERENCE FOR THE ADOPTION
OF A PROTOCOL ON PSYCHOTROPIC SUBSTANCES

Draft Report of the Technical Committee on Schedules I, II, III and IV

The Technical Committee discussed the lists of substances in Schedules I, II, III and IV of the Revised Draft Protocol on Psychotropic Substances^{1/} during its 3rd, 4th, 5th, 6th, 7th and 8th sessions.

The Committee was confronted with the problem of not knowing the measures of control being applied for the different schedules. Therefore, the Committee expressed the wish to review its decisions on schedules (and discussion on salts, etc.) in the light of the decisions taken by the Committee on Control Measures. The addition of other substances to the various schedules will be discussed also at this later date.

The Technical Committee agreed to present the Schedules of a provisional nature to the Committee on Control Measures, as follows:

Schedules I, II, III and IV

Proposals to add pipradol, aminorex, ethylamphetamine, phendimetrazine and morning glory seeds to the list were rejected by the Committee.

The Delegate of Venezuela suggested placing all the substances of Schedule II in Schedule I. The Delegate announced his reservation, as this proposal had been rejected by the Committee.

Proposals for the inclusion of barbital, meprobamate, methylphenobarbital and phenobarbital in Schedule III, and the inclusion of some barbiturates in Schedule II were rejected by the Committee.
