Introduction

1. In 2022, the Security Council returned to its normal conduct of business in terms of working methods, after the restrictions imposed by the coronavirus (COVID-19 pandemic). There was no need to hold videoconference meetings and, in the second half of the year, closed consultations resumed in the consultations room. The Council aimed for an adequate balance between transparency and confidentiality, in line with its efforts in previous years.

2. The Council held a total of 292 formal meetings, including 276 public meetings and 16 private meetings. There were 127 closed consultations and five informal interactive dialogues. Wrap-up sessions were also held each month by Presidents of the Council. In 2022, 85 unscheduled meetings were held at the request of Council members, compared with 34 in 2021.

3. In 2022, the Council extended a total of 445 invitations under rule 39, of which 242 were to men (54 per cent) and 203 were to women (46 per cent). In addition, out of 445 invitations, 272 were extended to officials from the United Nations system, 70 to officials representing regional intergovernmental organizations and 14 to invitees from international organizations other than the United Nations, non-governmental organizations and civil society. In total, 54 per cent of the briefings were delivered by men and 46 per cent by women, compared with 44 per cent in 2021 and 34 per cent in 2020.

4. During the reporting period, the Council adopted 54 resolutions and seven presidential statements (compared with 24 in 2021) and issued 67 statements to the press. Thirty-six resolutions, or 66 per cent, were adopted unanimously. On four occasions, the casting of a veto by one or more Council members prevented the adoption of a resolution: two on Ukraine; one on Non-Proliferation/Democratic People's Republic of Korea; and one on the Syrian Arab Republic. Pursuant to General Assembly resolution [76/262](#) of 26 April 2022, the Security Council submitted three special reports to the General Assembly. One resolution was adopted by the Security Council in accordance with General Assembly resolution [377 A \(V\)](#).

5. The Security Council considered a total of 49 items, including two new items. The Council maintained its attention on the humanitarian consequences of the conflicts of which it is seized and their impact on civilians and children, as well as on the role of women in preventing and resolving conflict.

6. The Council also held discussions and exchanged views on a range of emerging issues, including technology and security, the nexus between conflict and food insecurity and mental health and psychosocial support of United Nations peace operations personnel.

7. The sanctions regimes remained an important tool for the Council. Ten sanctions regimes were renewed in 2022, and a new one was established for Haiti.

8. The Council adopted decisions regarding nine peacekeeping operations and eight special political missions in 2022. At the end of the year, peacekeepers were deployed across 12 missions in support of the Council's mandates. Council members noted with appreciation the contribution of United Nations peacekeepers to international peace and security and paid tribute to the 96 peacekeepers who had sacrificed their lives on the job in 2022.

9. Further information on the work of the Council and more detailed reports of its meetings can be found in the monthly assessments of its work. The goal of the present introduction is not to provide an exhaustive list of meetings, developments or responses of the Council. It is intended as a succinct and useful overview of key developments, taking into account monthly assessments and responding to the remarks made by Member States during the plenary meeting of the General Assembly on the annual report of the Council for 2021 ([A/76/2](#)), on 9 June 2022.

Africa

Burkina Faso

10. The Council paid close attention to the situation in Burkina Faso following two military takeovers. On 8 February, it held closed consultations and on 9 February, it issued a statement to the press expressing concern about the 24 January unconstitutional change of Government. On 7 October, it released a statement to the press expressing concern about the 30 September unconstitutional change of Government and underscoring the urgent need for the restoration of constitutional order in Burkina Faso in accordance with the Protocol on Democracy and Good Governance of the Economic Community of West African States.

Central African region

11. The Council held biannual meetings on the activities of the United Nations Regional Office for

Central Africa (UNOCA), on which it was briefed by the Assistant Secretary-General for Africa, Martha Ama Akyaa Pobee; the Special Representative of the Secretary-General for Central Africa and Head of UNOCA, Abdou Abarry; as well as by the President of the Commission of the Economic Community of Central African States, Gilberto da Piedade Veríssimo. The Special Representative of the Secretary-General for Central Africa and Head of UNOCA was appointed on 28 July, replacing François Louncény Fall. The electoral processes in the region was the main point of discussion at the meetings, as well as the security situation in some affected countries.

Central African Republic

12. The Council held regular meetings and consultations on the situation in the Central African Republic.

13. In statements to the press issued on 5 October and 25 November, the Council condemned attacks perpetrated against the United Nations Multidimensional Integrated Stabilization Mission in the Central African Republic (MINUSCA), that had resulted in the deaths of peacekeepers from Bangladesh and Morocco.

14. The Council heard interventions from the Executive Secretary of the International Conference on the Great Lakes Region, João Samuel Caholo, and from the African Union Special Representative, Bertino Matías Matondo, during its public meeting of 22 February, as well as from the Special Representative of the Secretary-General for the Central African Republic and Head of MINUSCA, Valentine Rugwabiza, during its meetings of 22 June and 19 October.

15. By its resolution [2648 \(2022\)](#), adopted on 29 July, the Council renewed the sanctions regime.

16. By its resolution [2659 \(2022\)](#), adopted on 14 November, the Council extended the mandate of MINUSCA.

Democratic Republic of the Congo

17. The Council held several meetings and consultations on the situation concerning the Democratic Republic of the Congo. The Council approved a presidential statement ([S/PRST/2022/4](#)) on 3 June in which it welcomed positive political developments, such as regional diplomatic efforts – including the second Regional Heads of State Conclave on the Democratic Republic of Congo, held in Nairobi on 21 April 2022 – to end the conflict in that country, and expressed concern over increased activities of armed groups, including the Mouvement du 23 mars (M-23). It issued

statements on the situation concerning the Democratic Republic of the Congo and on the United Nations Organization Stabilization Mission in the Democratic Republic of the Congo (MONUSCO) on 4 February, 5 April, 24 May, 12 July and 27 July, 3 October and 22 November.

18. The Council renewed the sanctions regime and the mandate of the Group of Experts by its resolution [2641 \(2022\)](#), adopted on 30 June. The mandate of MONUSCO was extended until 20 December 2023 by its resolution [2666 \(2022\)](#), adopted on 20 December. By its resolution [2667 \(2022\)](#), also adopted on 20 December, the Council lifted the notification requirements set out in paragraph 5 of resolution [1807 \(2008\)](#).

Ethiopia

19. The Council continued to follow to the situation in the north of Ethiopia, following the outbreak of armed clashes in that region in November 2020 and their subsequent evolution, and the regional efforts to negotiate a peace agreement.

20. The Council held four meetings on the matter. On 27 January and 14 April, it held closed consultations. On 28 September, it held an informal interactive dialogue. On 21 October, it held a private meeting under the item “Peace and security in Africa”, at which it was briefed by the African Union High Representative for the Horn of Africa Region, Olusegun Obasanjo, and the Director for Operations and Advocacy of the United Nations Office for the Coordination of Humanitarian Affairs, Ghada Eltahir Mudawi; closed consultations were also held that day.

Great Lakes region

21. The Council held biannual meetings on recent developments in the Great Lakes region, including the implementation of the Peace, Security and Cooperation Framework for the Democratic Republic of the Congo and the Region of 2013. It issued statements to the press on this matter on 28 April and 28 October.

Libya

22. The Council continued to follow closely the situation in Libya in 2022 through regular meetings and consultations, held on 24 January, 16 March, 26 May, 27 June, 25 July, 30 August, 24 October, 15 November, and 16 December.

23. On 31 January 2022, the Security Council unanimously adopted resolution [2619 \(2022\)](#), which extended the mandate of the United Nations Support Mission in Libya (UNSMIL) for three months, until

30 April. Subsequent three-month renewals of the mandate of UNSMIL were approved on 29 April, with the Security Council unanimously adopting resolution [2629 \(2022\)](#), which also requested UNSMIL to implement the recommendations of the independent strategic review of the Mission ([S/2021/716](#)), and called upon the Secretary-General to appoint a Special Representative for Libya promptly; and on 28 July, with the adoption by the Security Council, by a vote of 12 in favour to none against, with 3 abstentions, of resolution [2647 \(2022\)](#), which again underscored the urgent need to appoint a Head of Mission. Subsequently, on 28 October, the Security Council unanimously adopted resolution [2656 \(2022\)](#), which extended the mandate of UNSMIL for 12 months and welcomed the appointment of Abdoulaye Bathily as Special Representative of the Secretary-General for Libya and Head of UNSMIL, who officially assumed his duties on 25 September.

24. On 20 May, the Security Council Committee established pursuant to resolution [1970 \(2011\)](#) concerning Libya held informal consultations to consider the final report of its Panel of Experts, pursuant to paragraph 13 of resolution [2571 \(2021\)](#), which was submitted to the Council on 25 May 2022. The Committee also met in informal consultations, on 4 November, to hear a presentation by the Panel of Experts on its work programme under the mandate extended by Council resolution [2644 \(2022\)](#).

25. On 3 June, the Council, by a vote of 14 in favour to none against, with one abstention, adopted resolution [2635 \(2022\)](#), which renewed the authorization for Member States – acting nationally or through regional organizations – to inspect vessels on the high seas off the coast of Libya which they have reasonable ground to believe are carrying arms or related materiel to or from that country, in violation of the arms embargo imposed on that country.

26. On 13 July, the Council unanimously adopted resolution [2644 \(2022\)](#), by which it extended, until 30 October 2023, the measures against the illicit export of crude oil and other petroleum products from Libya and the mandate of the Panel of Experts.

27. On 1 September, the Council issued a statement to the press condemning the violent clashes perpetrated by armed groups in Tripoli on 27 August, resulting in civilian casualties and destruction of civilian infrastructure.

28. On 29 September, the Council unanimously adopted resolution [2652 \(2022\)](#), which renewed for one year the authorization for Member States – acting nationally or through regional organizations – to inspect vessels on the high seas off the coast of Libya suspected

of being used for migrant smuggling and trafficking in persons in Libya.

29. On 20 December, the Council issued a statement to the press expressing concern at the persistent political deadlock, almost one year after elections were scheduled to take place on 24 December 2021, as well as support for the work of UNSMIL and the Special Representative of the Secretary-General.

Mali

30. The Council held regular meetings and consultations on Mali. It heard briefings by the Special Representative of the Secretary-General for Mali and Head of the United Nations Multidimensional Integrated Stabilization Mission in Mali (MINUSMA), El Ghassim Wane, and representatives of civil society organizations: Adam Dicko on 11 January; Bouaré Bintou on 7 April; and Sadya Touré on 13 June. The Special Representative of the Secretary-General for Mali and Head of MINUSMA also briefed the Council on 18 October.

31. By its resolution [2640 \(2022\)](#), adopted on 29 June, the Council extended the mandate of MINUSMA until 30 June 2023. By its resolution [2649 \(2022\)](#), adopted on 30 August, it renewed the sanctions regime with regard to Mali until 31 August 2023 and extended the mandate of the panel of experts until 30 September 2023.

32. The Committee met on 28 July to hear a presentation by the Panel of Experts on its final report, pursuant to paragraph 4 of resolution [2590 \(2021\)](#), which was submitted to the Security Council on 3 August 2022. On 23 November, the Chair of the Committee briefed the Security Council on the Committee's activities, in accordance with paragraph 18 of resolution [2374 \(2017\)](#).

33. The Council issued further statements to the press on 7 March, 1 and 20 June, 5 July, 17 October and 16 December, following deadly attacks against MINUSMA peacekeepers.

Somalia

34. The Council held regular meetings and consultations on the situation in Somalia. On 15 February, it heard briefings by the Special Representative of the Secretary-General for Somalia and Head of the United Nations Assistance Mission in Somalia (UNSOM), James Swan; the Special Representative of the Chairperson of the African Union Commission for Somalia and Head of the African Union Mission in Somalia (AMISOM), Francisco Caetano José Madeira; and the Head of the Delegation of the European Union to the United Nations, Olof Skoog. On

23 May, it heard briefings by the Special Representative of the Secretary-General for Somalia and Head of UNSOM and the Special Representative of the Chairperson of the African Union Commission for Somalia and Head of AMISOM. On 7 September, it heard briefings by the Special Representative of the Secretary-General for Somalia and Head of UNSOM; the Deputy Special Representative of the Chairperson of the African Union Commission for Somalia and Acting Head of the African Union Transition Mission in Somalia (ATMIS), Fiona Lortan; and the Special Representative of the European Union for the Horn of Africa, Annette Weber. Consultations followed those meetings.

35. The Council held regular meetings on the activities of the Committee established pursuant to resolution [751 \(1992\)](#) concerning Al-Shabaab. On 21 June, it heard a briefing by the Chair of the Committee and Permanent Representative of Ireland to the United Nations, Geraldine Byrne Nason, covering activities from 25 February to 21 June. On 19 October, it heard a briefing by the Chair of the Committee and Permanent Representative of Ireland to the United Nations, Fergal Tomas Mythen, covering activities from 22 June to 19 October. On 12 December, it heard an assessment by the Chair of the two-year period during which the Permanent Representatives of Ireland to the United Nations chaired the Committee.

36. The Council, by its resolution [2628 \(2022\)](#) unanimously adopted on 31 March, reconfigured AMISOM into the African Union Transition Mission in Somalia (ATMIS) and established a timeline for a phased handover of security responsibilities to Somalia until December 2024. On 21 December, the Security Council adopted resolution [2670 \(2022\)](#) extending Phase 1 of ATMIS until 30 June 2023.

37. The Council renewed the mandate of UNSOM until 31 October by its resolution [2632 \(2022\)](#), unanimously adopted on 26 May, and requested the Secretary-General to undertake a strategic review of UNSOM until 30 September. By its resolution [2657 \(2022\)](#), adopted on 31 October, the Council renewed the mandate of UNSOM until 31 October 2023.

38. The Council renewed the sanctions regime with regard to Somalia until 15 November 2023 by its resolution [2662 \(2022\)](#), adopted on 17 November, including the authorization for maritime interdiction to enforce the embargo on illicit arms imports, the charcoal exports ban and the improvised explosive device components ban, the partial lifting of the arms embargo for the Somali security sector and the humanitarian exemptions to the regime.

39. On 24 March, the Council issued a statement to the press following attacks by Al-Shabaab in Mogadishu and Beledweyne. On 6 May, the Council released a statement to the press following an attack by Al-Shabaab against the ATMIS Forward operating base in Elbaraf, which led to the death of Burundi National Defence Force troops. Another statement to the press was issued on 1 November following an attack by Al-Shabaab that killed at least 100 people in Mogadishu.

South Sudan

40. The Council held regular meetings and consultations on the situation in South Sudan. On 3 March, the Special Representative of the Secretary-General for South Sudan and Head of the United Nations Mission in South Sudan (UNMISS), Nicholas Haysom, briefed the Council and the troop- and police-contributing countries. On 7 March, the Council heard briefings by the Special Representative of the Secretary-General in South Sudan and Head of UNMISS; the interim Chair of the reconstituted Joint Monitoring and Evaluation Commission of the Intergovernmental Authority on Development, Charles Tai Gituai; and a representative of civil society, Riya Williams Yuyada. On 20 June, the Council heard briefings by the Special Representative of the Secretary-General in South Sudan and Head of UNMISS; the Acting Director of the Operations and Advocacy Division of the Office for the Coordination of Humanitarian Affairs, Ghada Eltahir Mudawi; and a representative of civil society, Lorna Merekaje. On 16 September, the Council heard briefings by the Special Representative of the Secretary-General in South Sudan and Head of UNMISS and a representative of civil society, Lilian Riziq. On 13 December, the Council heard briefings by the Special Representative of the Secretary-General in South Sudan and Head of UNMISS and Mr. Gituai. Consultations followed those meetings.

41. The Council held a meeting on the activities of the Committee established pursuant to resolution [2206 \(2015\)](#) concerning South Sudan. On 13 December, the Council heard a briefing by the Chair of the Committee and Permanent Representative of Gabon to the United Nations, Michel Xavier Biang, covering the activities of the Committee in 2022.

42. The Council renewed the mandate of UNMISS until 15 March 2023 by its resolution [2625 \(2022\)](#), adopted on 15 March. It renewed the sanctions regime with regard to South Sudan until 31 May 2023 by its resolution [2633 \(2022\)](#), adopted on 26 May.

Sudan

43. The Council held regular meetings and consultations on the situation in the Sudan. On 28 March, 24 May and 7 December, it heard briefings by the Special Representative of the Secretary-General for the Sudan and Head of the United Nations Integrated Transition Assistance Mission in the Sudan (UNITAMS), Volker Perthes. On 13 September, it heard briefings by the Special Representative of the Secretary-General for the Sudan and Head of UNITAMS and a representative of civil society, Ibrahim Mudawi. Consultations followed these meetings. The Council held closed meetings on 12 January and 27 April.

44. The Council heard biannual briefings on Darfur by the Prosecutor of the International Criminal Court, Karim Khan, on 17 January and 23 August. Mr. Khan presented his report pursuant to resolution [1593 \(2005\)](#) and informed the Council of the latest developments in the work of his Office regarding the situation in Darfur.

45. The Council held regular meetings on the activities of the Committee established pursuant to resolution [1591 \(2005\)](#) concerning the Sudan. On 28 March, the Chair of the Committee and Permanent Representative of Ghana to the United Nations, Harold Adlai Agyeman, briefed the Council on the activities of the Committee from 11 December 2021 to 28 March. On 21 June and on 13 September, the Council heard briefings by the Chair covering Committee activities from 29 March to 21 June and from 22 June to 13 September, respectively. On 7 December, the Deputy Permanent Representative of Ghana to the United Nations, Carolyn Oppong-Ntiri, briefed the Council on behalf of the Chair of the Committee on the activities of the Committee from 13 September to 7 December.

46. By its resolution [2620 \(2022\)](#), adopted on 15 February, the Council extended until 12 March 2023 the mandate of the Panel of Experts which assists the Committee established pursuant to resolution [1591 \(2005\)](#). By its resolution [2636 \(2022\)](#), unanimously adopted on 3 June, the Council renewed the mandate of UNITAMS until 3 June 2023 through a technical rollover.

47. The Council issued a statement to the press on 29 April following attacks against civilians, mass displacements and assaults to health-care facilities in West Darfur. It also released a statement to the press on 8 December welcoming the signing of the political framework agreement.

Sudan, South Sudan and Abyei

48. The Council held regular meetings and consultations on the situation in Abyei. On 21 April, it

heard briefings by the Under-Secretary-General for Peace Operations, Jean-Pierre Lacroix, and the Special Envoy of the Secretary-General for the Horn of Africa, Hanna Serwaa Tetteh. On 27 October, the Council held briefings by the Special Envoy of the Secretary-General for the Horn of Africa and the Assistant Secretary-General for Africa. Consultations followed those meetings.

49. By its resolution [2630 \(2022\)](#), unanimously adopted on 12 May, the Council extended until 15 November the mandate of the United Nations Interim Security Force for Abyei (UNISFA). By its resolution [2660 \(2022\)](#), unanimously adopted on 14 November, the Council renewed until 15 November 2023 the mandate of UNISFA and the Force's support to the Joint Border Verification and Monitoring Mechanism.

Western Sahara

50. The Council held biannual consultations on the situation concerning Western Sahara on 20 April and 17 October.

51. By its resolution [2654 \(2022\)](#), adopted on 29 October, by 13 votes in favour with two abstentions, the Council extended the mandate of the United Nations Mission for the Referendum in Western Sahara (MINURSO) until 31 October 2023. In the same resolution, the Council emphasized the need to achieve a realistic, practicable, enduring and mutually acceptable political solution based on compromise and called upon the parties to resume negotiations under the auspices of the Secretary-General without preconditions and in good faith.

Peace consolidation in West Africa

52. The Council held biannual meetings on the activities of the United Nations Office for West Africa and the Sahel (UNOWAS). At the first one, on 10 January, it heard briefings by the Special Representative of the Secretary-General for West Africa and the Sahel and Head of UNOWAS, Khatir Mahamat Saleh Annadif; the Executive Director of the United Nations Office on Drugs and Crime, Ghada Fathi Waly; and a speaker on behalf of the People's Coalition for the Sahel, Cécile Thiombiano Yougbaré. At the second meeting, held on 7 July, it heard briefings by the Special Representative of the Secretary-General for West Africa and the Sahel and Head of UNOWAS; the Chair of the Peacebuilding Commission, Rabab Fatima; and a speaker on behalf of the People's Coalition for the Sahel, Rabia Djibo Magagi.

Peace and security in Africa

53. On 31 May, the Council unanimously adopted resolution [2634 \(2022\)](#), on piracy and armed robbery at sea in the Gulf of Guinea.

Group of Five for the Sahel

54. Under the item “Peace and Security in Africa”, the Council held biannual meetings and consultations on the Group of Five for the Sahel. On 18 May, it heard briefings by the Assistant Secretary-General for Africa in the Departments of Political and Peacebuilding Affairs and Peace Operations; the Executive Secretary of the Group of Five for the Sahel, Eric Tiaré; and the Coordinator and President of the Rights and Resources Initiative/Group, Solange Bandiaky-Badji. On 16 November, in addition to briefings by Assistant Secretary-General for Africa and the Executive Secretary, it also heard from a civil society representative, Zakaria Ousman Ramadan.

Americas

Colombia

55. The Council held regular meetings and consultations on Colombia, which included briefings from the Special Representative of the Secretary-General for Colombia and Head of the United Nations Verification Mission in Colombia, Carlos Ruiz Massieu, and representatives of civil society. It issued statements to the press on 27 January, 22 July and 14 October, in which the members of the Council reiterated their full and unanimous support for the peace process in Colombia. Council members also commended the announcement on the resumption of talks between the Government and the Ejército de Liberación Nacional.

56. On 27 October, the Council unanimously adopted resolution [2655 \(2022\)](#), by which it extended the mandate of the United Nations Verification Mission in Colombia until 31 October 2023, and requested the Secretary-General to provide detailed recommendations, within 45 days of the adoption of the resolution, on how the verification of the ethnic and rural chapters of the Final Agreement for Ending the Conflict and Building a Stable and Lasting Peace would be carried out, as requested by the Minister for Foreign Affairs of Colombia. On 9 December, the Secretary-General recommended that the Security Council respond positively to the request conveyed by the Government of Colombia and authorize the addition of those tasks to the mandate of the Verification Mission ([S/2022/940](#)).

Haiti

57. The Council held regular meetings and consultations on the situation in Haiti. On 29 April, the Secretary-General issued a letter to the Security Council ([S/2022/369](#)), conveying his findings regarding the assessment conducted on the mandate of the United Nations Integrated Office in Haiti (BINUH), as requested in resolution [2600 \(2021\)](#).

58. On 15 July, the Council extended the mandate of BINUH for one year, unanimously adopting its resolution [2645 \(2022\)](#). Given the deteriorating security situation in Haiti, the Council called on Member States to prohibit the transfer of small arms, light weapons and ammunition to non-State actors engaged in or supporting gang violence, criminal activities or human rights abuses in Haiti. The Council expressed readiness to take appropriate measures, as necessary, that could include asset freeze or travel ban measures against those engaged in or supporting gang violence, criminal activities or human rights abuses within 90 days from the adoption of the resolution. The Council also requested the Secretary-General to consult with the Government of Haiti, relevant countries and regional organizations on possible options for enhanced security support for the Haitian National Police. The Secretary-General submitted a report to the Council on those consultations in a letter to the President of the Security Council dated 8 October 2022 ([S/2022/747](#)).

59. On 21 October, the Council unanimously approved a sanctions regime for Haiti, by adopting resolution [2653 \(2022\)](#). Besides an arms embargo, the resolution includes sanctions such as assets freeze and travel bans against those engaging in or supporting criminal activity and violence. The resolution specifically sanctions gang leader, Jimmy Cherizier, known by his alias “Barbecue”.

60. On 21 December, the Security Council Committee pursuant to resolution [2653 \(2022\)](#) concerning Haiti was established, with the Permanent Representative of Gabon, Michel Xavier Biang as its Chair. The Council also heard a briefing from the Deputy Secretary-General, Amina Mohammed, detailing the humanitarian challenges and the security concerns faced by the Haitian population.

Asia

Afghanistan

61. The Council held quarterly debates on Afghanistan on 2 March, 23 June, 27 September and 20 December. In addition, it held meetings on the evolving situation in Afghanistan on 26 January, 25 March, 12 May and 29 August.

62. On 17 March, the Council adopted resolution [2626 \(2022\)](#), on the mandate of the United Nations Assistance Mission in Afghanistan (UNAMA), updating and renewing it for one year and requesting the Secretary-General to report to the Council every three months.

63. On 6 October, the Secretary-General appointed Roza Otunbayeva as his Special Representative for Afghanistan and Head of UNAMA.

64. On 16 December, acting under Chapter VII of the Charter of the United Nations, the Council unanimously adopted resolution [2665 \(2022\)](#), by which it renewed by one year the mandate of the Analytical Support and Sanctions Monitoring Team with regard to sanctions against Taliban-linked entities in Afghanistan.

65. The Council issued statements to the press on Afghanistan on 27 March; 20, 22, 29 and 30 April; 24 May; and 1, 2 and 27 December.

Myanmar

66. The Council held private meetings on Myanmar on 28 January and 27 May. It also held consultations on 16 September.

67. The Council issued statements to the press on 2 February and, in reaction to the execution of opposition activists, on 27 July.

68. On 21 December, the Council adopted resolution [2669 \(2022\)](#), by which it demanded the end of all forms of violence, urged the military to release arbitrarily detained prisoners, reiterated the necessity for full, safe and unhindered humanitarian access and expressed support for the central role of the Association of Southeast Asian Nations.

Armenia and Azerbaijan

69. The Council met on 14 September, in closed consultations, to discuss recent border clashes between Armenia and Azerbaijan. On 15 September, the Assistant Secretary-General for Europe, Central Asia and the Americas, Miroslav Jenča, briefed the Council about developments on the ground.

70. On 20 December, another meeting was convened during which the Assistant Secretary-General briefed the Council on ongoing restrictions of movement along the Lachin corridor. The issue had also been discussed briefly in closed consultations on 16 December.

United Nations Regional Centre for Preventive Diplomacy for Central Asia

71. The Council held biannual consultations on 27 January and 28 July.

Europe

Bosnia and Herzegovina

72. The Council held meetings on the situation of Bosnia and Herzegovina on 11 May and 2 November. On 2 November, it adopted resolution [2658 \(2022\)](#), which authorized the renewal of the European Union military operation for an additional 12 months.

Cyprus

73. The Council met for consultations on the situation in Cyprus on 17 January and 18 July.

74. On 21 January, the Council adopted resolution [2618 \(2022\)](#), which extended the mandate of the United Nations Peacekeeping Force in Cyprus (UNFICYP) until 31 July 2022. On 28 July, it adopted resolution [2646 \(2022\)](#), extending the mandate of UNFICYP for an additional six months.

Kosovo

75. On 20 April and 18 October, the Special Representative of the Secretary-General for Kosovo and Head of the United Nations Interim Administration Mission in Kosovo (UNMIK), Caroline Ziadeh, briefed the Council on the latest developments in Kosovo and the efforts by UNMIK to mediate dialogue between Belgrade and Pristina.

Ukraine

76. The Council met 46 times to discuss aspects of the conflict in Ukraine under different items. There was also a private meeting on 27 October, after which the Council issued an official communiqué.

77. On 27 February, the Council adopted resolution [2623 \(2022\)](#), calling for an emergency special session of the General Assembly on the conflict in Ukraine. Four other draft resolutions related to the crisis were not adopted by the Council.

78. On 6 May, the President of the Security Council issued a statement ([S/PRST/2022/3](#)) expressing deep concern regarding the maintenance of peace and security in Ukraine and strong support for the efforts of the Secretary-General in the search for a peaceful solution to the conflict.

Middle East

Iraq

79. The Council held periodic meetings and consultations, with the participation of the Special

Representative of the Secretary-General for Iraq and Head of the United Nations Assistance Mission for Iraq (UNAMI), Jeanine Hennis-Plasschaert, on 24 February, 17 May and 4 October, which were convened pursuant to resolutions [2576 \(2021\)](#) and [2631 \(2022\)](#) to examine the progress in the implementation of the mandate of UNAMI, adopted under Chapter VI of the Charter of the United Nations upon the request of the Government of Iraq.

80. On 24 January, the Security Council issued a statement to the press condemning the 21 January terrorist attack in Diyala Province, Iraq, which resulted in at least 11 deaths.

81. On 22 February, the Security Council unanimously adopted resolution [2621 \(2022\)](#), which confirmed that the United Nations Compensation Commission had fulfilled its mandate in processing claims and paying compensation for losses and damage suffered by Kuwait as a direct result of the unlawful invasion and occupation of its territory by Iraq in 1990.

82. On 3 March, the Security Council, through its Committee established pursuant to resolution [1518 \(2003\)](#), removed seven entries from its sanctions list; on 19 May three additional entries were removed; and, on 30 August, one entry was removed from the list.

83. On 26 May, the Security Council unanimously adopted resolution [2631 \(2022\)](#), which extended the mandate of UNAMI for one year, until 31 May 2023, retaining its main functions, upon the request of the Government of Iraq, including the core task of UNAMI of prioritizing the provision of advice, support and assistance on advancing political dialogue and national and community-level reconciliation in Iraq.

84. On 8 June and 5 December, the Security Council was briefed by the Special Adviser and Head of the United Nations Investigative Team to Promote Accountability for Crimes Committed by Da'esh/Islamic State in Iraq and the Levant (ISIL) (UNITAD), Christian Ritscher, on the eighth ([S/2022/434](#)) and ninth reports ([S/2022/836](#)) of UNITAD, including progress in the investigation of international crimes committed by ISIL (Da'esh) in Iraq and the corresponding cooperation with Iraqi authorities.

85. On 25 July, the Security Council issued a statement to the press condemning the attack in Dohuk Governorate on 20 July 2022, in the autonomous Kurdistan Region of Iraq, which resulted in the death of at least nine civilians, including children.

86. On 26 July, the Security Council met for an open briefing, followed by closed consultations, to discuss the 20 July attack in Dohuk Governorate, in the

autonomous Kurdistan Region of Iraq. The Special Representative of the Secretary-General for Iraq and Head of UNAMI briefed the Council. The Minister for Foreign Affairs of Iraq, Fuad Hussein, represented Iraq during the briefing.

87. On 1 September, the Security Council issued a statement to the press condemning the violence throughout Iraq on 29 and 30 August, which reportedly resulted in deaths and injuries, as well as taking note of the efforts by the Government of Iraq to restore order.

88. On 15 September, the Security Council unanimously adopted resolution [2651 \(2022\)](#), which extended the mandate of UNITAD for one year, until 17 September 2023, upon the request of the Government of Iraq, to continue assisting Iraq in the investigation of international crimes committed by ISIL (Da'esh) in Iraqi territory.

89. On 20 December, the Security Council issued a statement to the press condemning terrorist attacks near Kirkuk and Albu Bali, in Iraq, claimed by ISIL (Da'esh) and which resulted in the deaths of at least nine Iraqi policemen and eight civilians.

Lebanon

90. On 4 February, the Council issued a statement to the press on the overall situation in Lebanon, underlining the importance of holding free, fair, transparent and inclusive elections as scheduled on 15 May 2022 and of adopting urgent reform measures. They also deplored the incidents that took place in December 2021 and January 2022 in the area of operations of the United Nations Interim Force in Lebanon (UNIFIL) and recalled the necessity for all parties to ensure that UNIFIL personnel are safe and secure and their freedom of movement is fully respected and unimpeded. On 25 May, the Council issued a follow-up statement to the press, welcoming the holding of legislative elections in Lebanon as scheduled, despite challenging circumstances, and calling for the swift formation of a new inclusive Government and the urgent implementation of tangible reforms. On 7 July, another statement to the press was issued calling for the swift formation of a new Government in Lebanon.

91. On 31 August, the Council unanimously adopted resolution [2650 \(2022\)](#), by which it extended the mandate of UNIFIL until 31 August 2023.

92. On 19 October, the Council issued a statement to the press in which its members commended the announcement that Lebanon and Israel had agreed to end their dispute over their maritime boundary and delineate it permanently.

93. On 15 December, the Council issued a statement to the press condemning, in the strongest terms, the attack perpetrated against UNIFIL on 14 December in the area of Al-Aqbieh, in south Lebanon, which resulted in the death of one peacekeeper from Ireland and in injuries to three peacekeepers. They reiterated their full support for UNIFIL and called on the Government of Lebanon to swiftly investigate this attack and bring perpetrators to justice in accordance with Lebanese law.

Syrian Arab Republic

94. The three aspects of the Syrian crisis (political, humanitarian and chemical weapons) were regularly examined by the Council throughout 2022.

95. On 12 July, the Council adopted resolution [2642 \(2022\)](#), by 12 votes in favour with three abstentions, by which it renewed the United Nations cross-border mechanism authorization for six months, that is, until 10 January 2023, only for the border crossing at Bab al-Hawa, with a further extension of additional six months, that is, until 10 July 2023, which will require a separate resolution confirming this extension; and requested the Secretary-General to provide a special report on the humanitarian needs in the Syrian Arab Republic. The resolution encouraged the convening of Security Council informal interactive dialogues every two months with the participation of donors, interested regional parties and representatives of the international humanitarian agencies operating in the Syrian Arab Republic. Informal interactive dialogues were held on 26 September, 21 November and 16 December.

96. The Special Envoy of the Secretary-General for Syria, Geir Otto Pedersen, briefed Council members on the developments towards the implementation of resolution [2254 \(2015\)](#).

97. The Under-Secretary-General and High Representative for Disarmament Affairs, Izumi Nakamitsu, also briefed the Council regularly on the implementation of resolution [2118 \(2013\)](#) and the relevant work of the Organisation for the Prohibition of Chemical Weapons. The members of the Council consistently condemned the use of chemical weapons under any pretext, anywhere and by anyone.

The situation in the Middle East, including the Palestinian question

98. The Council continued to hold regular open debates, briefings and consultations on the situation in the Middle East, including the Palestinian question, as well as quarterly briefings on the implementation of resolution [2334 \(2016\)](#). The Special Coordinator for the

Middle East Peace Process, Tor Wennesland, briefed the Council on those occasions.

99. On 19 April, the Council held an emergency meeting (consultations) following the escalation of violence in Jerusalem. On 8 August, the Council held an emergency open briefing, followed by consultations, to discuss developments in Gaza.

100. On 13 May, the Council issued a statement to the press in which its members strongly condemned the killing of Palestinian-American journalist Shireen Abu Akleh and the injury of another journalist in the Palestinian city of Jenin on 11 May and called for an immediate, thorough, transparent, and fair and impartial investigation into her killing, stressing the need for accountability.

Yemen

101. The Council received monthly briefings on the political, security and humanitarian situation in Yemen from the Special Envoy of the Secretary-General for Yemen, Hans Grundberg, as well as from the Office for the Coordination of Humanitarian Affairs and the Head of the United Nations Mission to Support the Hedaydah Agreement (UNMHA) and Chair of the Redeployment Coordination Committee, Major General Michael Beary.

102. On 28 February, the Council adopted resolution [2624 \(2022\)](#) by 11 votes in favour with 4 abstentions, by which it renewed the sanctions regime applicable to Yemen for an additional year, designated the Houthis as an entity under the targeted arms embargo, strongly condemned the cross-border terrorist attacks by the group and extended the mandate of the Panel of Experts on Yemen until 28 March 2023.

103. On 13 July, the Council adopted resolution [2643 \(2022\)](#), by which it extended the mandate of UNMHA until 14 July 2023 and, among other provisions, welcomed the establishment of UNMHA presence in government-controlled areas, in order to ensure its equal access and impartial assistance to all parties, and demanded the Houthis to guarantee the freedom of movement of UNMHA personnel, including by allowing announced and unannounced patrols.

104. In 2022, the Council issued eight statements to the press on the situation in Yemen.

United Nations Disengagement Observer Force

105. The Council adopted resolution [2639 \(2022\)](#) on 27 June, by which it renewed the mandate of the United Nations Disengagement Observer Force (UNDOF) in the Golan until 31 December 2022. On 22 December,

the Council adopted resolution [2671 \(2022\)](#), by which it renewed the mandate of UNDOF until 30 June 2023.

Thematic questions

United Nations peacekeeping operations

106. On 12 July, the Council held an open debate on “United Nations peacekeeping operations: the key role of strategic communications for efficient peacekeeping”. During the meeting, presided by the Minister for Foreign Affairs of Brazil, Carlos Alberto Franco França, the Council heard briefings by the Secretary-General, António Guterres; the Force Commander of the United Nations Organization Stabilization Mission in the Democratic Republic of the Congo, Lieutenant General Marcos De Sá Affonso Da Costa; and the Director of Research at the International Peace Institute, Jenna Russo. At the same meeting, the Council adopted a presidential statement on the matter ([S/PRST/2022/5](#)).

107. On 6 September, the Council held its annual ministerial-level open debate on peacekeeping reform pursuant to resolution [2378 \(2017\)](#), with a focus on the implementation of the Action for Peacekeeping initiative. The Council was briefed by the Under-Secretary-General for Peace Operations.

108. On 14 November, the Council held its annual briefing with the heads of police components of United Nations peace operations, during which it heard briefings by the Under-Secretary-General for Peace Operations; the Police Commissioner of the United Nations Mission in South Sudan, Christine Fossen; the Police Commissioner of the United Nations Organization Stabilization Mission in the Democratic Republic of the Congo, Mody Berethe; and a representative of the Kofi Annan International Peacekeeping Training Centre in Ghana, Emma Birikorang.

109. On 21 December, the Council unanimously adopted resolution [2668 \(2022\)](#) on the mental health and psychosocial support for United Nations peace operations personnel, encouraging troop- and police-contributing countries, including Member States and the United Nations Secretariat, as appropriate, to provide mental health services training to support personnel during predeployment, deployment and post-deployment.

International Residual Mechanism for Criminal Tribunals

110. On 31 March, the Council issued a presidential statement ([S/PRST/2022/2](#)), by which it requested the International Residual Mechanism for Criminal Tribunals to present by 14 April the report on the

progress of its work, including towards the completion of its functions, since its previous review in June 2020.

111. On 14 June, the President of the Mechanism, Carmel Agius, and its Prosecutor, Serge Brammertz, presented the fourth review report ([S/2022/319](#)) and the twentieth assessment and progress report of the Residual Mechanism to the Council. In preparation for this meeting, Gabon, as Chair of the Informal Working Group on International Tribunals, convened exchanges of views with the President of the Mechanism and the Prosecutor of the Mechanism on 13 June.

112. On 22 June, having conducted its biennial review of the progress of the work of the International Residual Mechanism for Criminal Tribunals, including in completing its functions, pursuant to paragraph 17 of resolution [1966 \(2010\)](#) and in accordance with the procedure set out in the presidential statement of 31 March 2022 ([S/PRST/2022/2](#)), the Council adopted resolution [2637 \(2022\)](#). In the resolution, the Council reappointed Serge Brammertz as Prosecutor of the Mechanism, for a term of two years with effect from 1 July 2022. It also welcomed the fourth review report submitted by the Mechanism to the Council ([S/2022/319](#)) and the report of the Office of Internal Oversight Services on the evaluation of the methods and work of the Mechanism ([S/2022/148](#)).

113. On 12 December, the new President of the Mechanism Judge Graciela Gatti Santana, appointed by the Secretary-General on 27 June 2022 as for a term from 1 July 2022 to 30 June 2024, and the Prosecutor presented the twenty-first assessment and progress report of the Residual Mechanism to the Council. Before this meeting, the Chair of the Informal Working Group on International Tribunals convened exchanges of views with the President and the Prosecutor of the Mechanism on 9 December.

Children and armed conflict

114. On 19 July 2022, the Council held a high-level open debate on children and armed conflict. The Council heard a briefing from the Executive Director of the United Nations Children’s Fund and the Special Representative of the Secretary-General on Children and Armed Conflict, as well as from a civil society representative and former child soldier, Patrick Kumi.

115. In 2022, the Working Group on Children and Armed Conflict adopted conclusions on children and armed conflict in the Central African Republic, Colombia, the Democratic Republic of Congo, the Philippines, the Sudan and Yemen. In 2022, the Working Group also worked on conclusions on Afghanistan, Myanmar, Nigeria, Somalia and the Syrian Arab

Republic. The Working Group also discussed other situations of concern as included in the global horizontal notes from the Secretary-General and his report.

Protection of civilians in armed conflict

116. On 25 January, the Council held a high-level open debate on the theme “War in cities: protection of civilians in urban settings”. The Council heard briefings by the Secretary-General, the President of the International Committee of the Red Cross, Peter Maurer and the Chair and co-founder of the Mwatana Organization for Human Rights, Radhya al-Mutawakel. The briefers highlighted the need to ensure accountability for perpetrators of violations of international law and ensure compliance with international humanitarian law in order to mitigate the devastating effects of urban warfare on civilian populations. More than 50 ministers, observers and representatives – some from conflict-affected States or regions – shared their perspectives and ideas of how to reduce harm to civilians in urban warfare situations. Member States underscored the importance of resolution [2573 \(2021\)](#) on attacks on critical infrastructure and the report of the Secretary-General on protection of civilians in armed conflict ([S/2021/423](#)) as guidance for the protection of civilians in conflict-ridden urban settings.

117. On 25 May, the Council held its annual open debate about the protection of civilians in armed conflict following the publication of the report of the Secretary-General on the matter ([S/2022/381](#)). The Council was briefed by the Director of Coordination in the Office for the Coordination of Humanitarian Affairs, Ramesh Rajasingham; the Director-General of the International Committee of the Red Cross, Robert Mardini; the President of the International Rescue Committee, David Miliband; and the Country Director for the Democratic Republic of the Congo at Women for Women International, Rachel Boketa. Despite a general understanding that there are already many legal instruments for ensuring the protection of civilians and safe and unhindered access to humanitarian relief, including Security Council resolutions, many member States pointed out ongoing violations to international humanitarian law and international human rights law, as well as practical hurdles to the work of humanitarian personnel. This includes attacks on civilians, humanitarian workers and civilian infrastructures, such as schools, hospitals, water and sanitation services and energy infrastructure. Several delegations recalled that the dire situation of civilians in conflict-ridden areas was worsened by the COVID-19 pandemic and various obstacles to the delivery of vaccines.

118. The United Nations High Commissioner for Refugees, Filippo Grandi, briefed the Council on 2 November. The briefing focused on the situation of refugees in several country-specific situations related to matters of which the Security Council is seized, as well as on current and emerging challenges that aggravate current trends in forced displacement. The High Commissioner called upon member States to secure adequate resources for coping with the growing refugee crises and to preserve humanitarian access. The Commissioner also highlighted the importance of the Global Compact on Refugees and the upcoming Global Refugee Forum, to be held in 2023.

General issues relating to sanctions

119. On 7 February, an open debate on general issues relating to sanctions preventing their humanitarian and unintended consequences was held at the Security Council. The Council heard briefings by the Under-Secretary-General for Political and Peacebuilding Affairs, Rosemary DiCarlo, and the Under-Secretary-General for Humanitarian Affairs and Emergency Relief Coordinator, Martin Griffiths. The briefers explained how aligning domestic legislation with Security Council language can alleviate the burden on humanitarian providers for compliance with due diligence and reporting requirements. They also welcomed the humanitarian carveout adopted in resolution [2615 \(2021\)](#) regarding the sanctions regimes on Afghanistan. Delegates emphasized the need to minimize the unintended negative impact of sanctions on populations they are meant to protect.

120. On 9 December, by a vote of 14 in favour and one abstention, the Security Council adopted resolution [2664 \(2022\)](#), whereby a humanitarian exemption to asset freeze measures applies across United Nations sanctions regimes, but only for an initial period of two years for the Security Council Committee pursuant to resolutions [1267 \(1999\)](#), [1989 \(2011\)](#) and [2253 \(2015\)](#) concerning Islamic State in Iraq and the Levant (Da’esh), Al-Qaida and associated individuals, groups, undertakings and entities. The exemption allows for the provision, processing or payment of funds, other financial assets or economic resources or the provision of goods and services necessary to ensure the timely delivery of humanitarian assistance and support to basic human needs in contexts where United Nations sanctions are in place.

Women and peace and security

121. Albania, Brazil, France, Ireland, Gabon, Kenya, Mexico, the Niger, Norway, the United Arab Emirates and the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Northern

Ireland formed a group of countries committed to prioritizing the advancement of the women and peace and security agenda during their respective presidency months. Five open debates on women and peace and security were organized during the presidencies of Albania, Gabon, Norway, the United Arab Emirates and the United Kingdom.

122. On 18 January, a ministerial-level open debate entitled “Protecting participation: addressing violence targeting women in peace and security processes” was chaired by the Minister for Foreign Affairs of Norway, Anniken Huitfeldt, with briefings from the United Nations High Commissioner for Human Rights, Michelle Bachelet; the Executive Director of the Women and Children Legal Research Foundation, Zarqa Yaftali; and the Executive Director of the NGO Working Group on Women, Peace and Security, Kaavya Asoka.

123. On 8 March, the Council held a ministerial-level open debate on enabling public-private partnerships to contribute to women’s economic empowerment in conflict-affected and fragile settings, chaired by the Minister of Climate Change and Environment of the United Arab Emirates, Mariam bint Mohammed Saeed Hareb Almheiri.

124. On 13 April, the Security Council held its annual open debate on conflict-related sexual violence. The meeting was entitled “Accountability as prevention: ending cycles of sexual violence in conflict” and chaired by the Minister of State for South Asia, North Africa, the United Nations and the Commonwealth at the Foreign, Commonwealth and Development Office of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Northern Ireland and Special Representative of the Prime Minister of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Northern Ireland on Preventing Sexual Violence in Conflict, Lord Ahmad of Wimbledon.

125. On 15 June, a ministerial-level open debate on the role of regional organizations in implementing the women and peace and security agenda in contexts of political turmoil and seizures of power by force was chaired by the Minister for Europe and Foreign Affairs of Albania, Olta Xhaçka.

126. On 20 October, the Security Council held its annual open debate on women and peace and security under the presidency of Gabon which was entitled “Women and peace and security: strengthening women’s resilience and leadership as a path to peace in regions plagued by armed groups”.

Briefing by the President of the International Court of Justice

127. On 26 October, the Council heard a briefing by the President of the International Court of Justice, Judge Joan Donoghue, at a private meeting. Judge Joan Donoghue told the Council about the challenges the Court faces for not having its jurisdiction recognized by all Member States and means of enforcement of its decisions. Judge Donoghue also explained how the Court can exercise its jurisdiction in contentious cases. Members of the Council highlighted the importance of the Court in the peaceful settlement of disputes between States and the promotion of the rule of law in the international community. Members of the Council also acknowledged the complementarity between the Council and the Court in their pursuit to achieve the main objectives of the United Nations.

Election of a member of the International Court of Justice

128. On 4 November, the Council held a meeting, independent and concurrently with the General Assembly, in which it elected Leonardo Nemer Caldeira Brant of Brazil to fill the vacancy in the International Court of Justice caused by the death of Judge Antônio Augusto Cançado Trindade on 29 May.

Referrals to the International Criminal Court

129. On 17 January and 23 August, the Council held semi-annual meetings on the International Criminal Court in relation to Darfur, during which the Prosecutor of the International Criminal Court, Karim Khan, presented his reports pursuant to resolution [1593 \(2005\)](#), providing an update on the latest developments in the work carried out by his Office regarding the situation in Darfur.

130. On 28 April and 9 November, the Council held semi-annual meetings on the International Criminal Court in relation to Libya, during which the Prosecutor of the International Criminal Court, Karim Khan, presented his reports pursuant to resolution [1970 \(2011\)](#), providing an update on the work carried out by his Office regarding the situation in Libya.

Threats to international peace and security caused by terrorist acts

131. The Council held semi-annual briefings on the threat posed by ISIL (Da’esh) to international peace and security on 9 February and 9 August. The briefings followed the release of biannual reports thereon by the Secretary-General. During the briefings, delegations voiced concerns on the persistent high number of

reported terrorist incidents and over alarming trends of their geographical spread, particularly with regard to the African continent.

132. On 6 October, the Security Council held a debate on the fight against the financing of armed groups and terrorists through the illicit trafficking of natural resources. The Minister for Foreign Affairs of Gabon, Michael Moussa Adamo, chaired the debate. The Executive Director of the United Nations Office on Drugs and Crime (UNODC), Ghada Waly, the African Union Commissioner for Political Affairs, Peace and Security, Bankole Adeoye, and the Regional Director for East Africa and Representative to the African Union of the Institute for Security Studies, Paul-Simon Handy, briefed the Council on trends regarding the illicit trafficking of natural resources, including wildlife, for the financing of terrorism and organized crime. Member States referred to a wide array of instruments the Security Council and the international community as a whole could resort to in order to curtail the illicit trafficking of natural resources in Africa and prevent it from providing terrorist and armed groups with a source of income. Delegations also commented on the distinction between terrorism and transnational organized crime.

133. On 10 November, the President of Ghana, Nana Akufo-Addo, chaired a high-level debate at the Security Council on counter-terrorism in Africa. The Deputy Secretary-General; the Chairperson of the African Union Commission, Moussa Faki Mahamat; the Managing Director for Common Security and Defence Policy and Crisis Response at the European External Action Service, Benedikta Von Seherr-Thoss; and the President and Chief Executive Officer of the International Crisis Group, Comfort Ero, briefed the Council. During the debate, delegations reflected on the role that United Nations missions in Africa can play in supporting regional counter-terrorism efforts; on how the United Nations can assist in building resilience among Member States in Africa in the face of terrorism and violent extremism, as and when conducive to terrorism, including in the Sahel region and Coastal West Africa; and on possible sources of funding for support to counter-terrorism in Africa. The contribution of regional initiatives to the maintenance of peace and security in Africa also featured prominently in the discussions. There was wide consensus on the need for the international community to address the conditions leading to terrorism and violent extremism as and when conducive to terrorism.

134. On 23 November, the Council received the annual joint briefing by its Committees established pursuant to resolutions [1267 \(1999\)](#), [1989 \(2011\)](#) and [2253 \(2015\)](#)

(ISIL (Da'esh) and Al-Qaida); [1373 \(2001\)](#) (Counter-terrorism); and [1540 \(2004\)](#) (proliferation of nuclear, chemical and biological weapons), respectively. The Chairs of the three Committees provided information on their activities during the current year and on the cooperation between them to combat terrorism and proliferation. Delegations acknowledged the role sanctions play in the maintenance of international peace, but expressed concerns over their unintended negative consequences for the civilian population.

135. On 15 December, the Council held a briefing entitled “Threats to international peace and security caused by terrorist acts: global counter-terrorism approach – principles and the way forward”. The Minister for Foreign Affairs of India, Subrahmanyam Jaishankar, chaired the meeting. The Under-Secretary-General of the Office of Counter-Terrorism, Vladimir Voronkov, the Acting Executive Director of Counter-Terrorism Committee Executive Directorate, Weixiong Chen, and a victim of terrorism, Anjali Vijay Kulthe, briefed the Council. The senior United Nations officials underlined the need for member States to address the drivers of radicalization to violence and counter the threat posed by the use of new and emerging technologies for terrorist purposes, while ensuring that any measures taken to counter terrorism comply with their obligations under international law. Delegations concurred in the importance of responding to the threat of terrorism in a comprehensive manner, including by addressing its root causes. On the occasion, the Council adopted a presidential statement on the threats international peace and security caused by terrorist acts ([S/PRST/2022/7](#)).

136. On 4 and 17 January, the Council removed five individuals and three entities, respectively, from the ISIL (Da'esh) and Al-Qaida Sanctions List. Following reviews by the Ombudsperson, the Council removed one individual on 24 January and two more on 3 March. On 7 March, the Council added one entity to the ISIL (Da'esh) and Al-Qaida Sanctions List.

137. The Council issued statements to the press on the terrorist attacks in the United Arab Emirates on 21 January; in Iraq on 24 January; in Pakistan on 6 March; MINUSMA on 7 March; in Somalia on 24 March; against Saudi Arabia on 4 April; in Afghanistan on 20 and 22 April; in Pakistan on 28 April; in Afghanistan on 29 and 30 April; against ATMIS on 6 May; against MINUSMA on 1 and 20 June and 5 July; in Afghanistan on 3, 7 and 30 September; against MINUSMA on 17 October; in Yemen on 26 October; in Somalia on 1 November; in Afghanistan against the Embassy of Pakistan on 2 December; against MINUSMA on 16 December; and in Iraq on 18 December.

Non-proliferation of weapons of mass destruction

138. On 25 February, the Council adopted resolution [2622 \(2022\)](#), extending the mandate of the Security Council Committee established pursuant to resolution [1540 \(2004\)](#) and its Group of Experts, until 30 November 2022.

139. On 30 November, the Council, acting under Chapter VII of the Charter of the United Nations, unanimously adopted resolution [2663 \(2022\)](#), extending the mandate of the Security Council Committee established pursuant to resolution [1540 \(2004\)](#) and its Group of Experts for 10 years, until 30 November 2032. The Council also endorsed the 2022 comprehensive review of the status of the implementation of resolution [1540 \(2004\)](#), taking note of its results, as contained in the final report, and encouraged the Committee established pursuant to resolution [1540 \(2004\)](#) to convene regular open briefings for Member States and international, regional and subregional organizations, inter alia, on the margins of the relevant sessions of the General Assembly.

Non-proliferation (Islamic Republic of Iran)

140. During meetings held in June and December, the Council discussed the implementation of its resolution [2231 \(2015\)](#), by which it had endorsed the Joint Comprehensive Plan of Action on the Iranian nuclear issue. Some Council members expressed their support for ongoing talks to revive the full implementation of the Plan of Action and called upon all parties to refrain from actions that could jeopardize a possible agreement.

Non-proliferation/Democratic People's Republic of Korea

141. The Council discussed the situation in the Democratic People's Republic of Korea on 10 January, 3 February, 25 March, 11 and 26 May, 5 October, 4 and 21 November, following missile launches. On 25 March, the Council adopted resolution [2627 \(2022\)](#), by which it renewed the mandate of the Panel of Experts until 30 April 2023. On 24 February, 27 May, 30 August and 28 November, the Security Council Committee established pursuant to resolution [1718 \(2006\)](#) concerning the Democratic People's Republic of Korea held consultations.

Maintenance of international peace and security

142. On 2 June, the Council held a high-level debate on "Strengthening accountability and justice for serious violations of international law". The President of the International Court of Justice, Judge Joan Donoghue, the United Nations High Commissioner for Human

Rights, Michelle Bachelet, and Professor Dapo Akande from the University of Oxford briefed the Council. The debate centred on the role of the Security Council in ensuring accountability for serious violations of international law; its cooperation in this respect with the International Court of Justice, the Office of the United Nations High Commissioner for Human Rights and regional and subregional organizations and initiatives; the contribution of the media and civil society to the fight against impunity; and means of reparations for victims.

143. On 22 August, the Council held a briefing on "Maintenance of international peace and security: promoting common security through dialogue and cooperation". The Council heard briefings by the Secretary-General, and by the President of the Tenth Review Conference of the Treaty on the Non-Proliferation of Nuclear Weapons, Gustavo Zlauvinen. The briefers highlighted the need to strengthen the international peace and security architecture against the backdrop of a deteriorating security environment and the persistence of the threat posed by nuclear weapons. Delegations expressed their views on fundamental issues concerning international security and nuclear disarmament.

Conflict and food security

144. On 19 May, the Security Council held an open debate on conflict and food security. The Secretary-General; the Executive Director of the World Food Programme, David Beasley; the Director-General of the Food and Agriculture Organization of the United Nations, Qu Dongyu; and the Chief Executive Officer of Gro Intelligence, Sara Menker, briefed the Council. Briefers warned that an international food availability crisis could arise as soon as 2023. There was a general understanding among Council members that global food security was deteriorating, including in countries affected by conflicts. Delegates also agreed that more needs to be done to alleviate hunger and food insecurity in those countries and reverse the current trend, especially in the framework of Council resolution [2417 \(2018\)](#), taking into account that conflict is a main driver of food insecurity. Briefers, Council members and participants in accordance with rule 37 discussed different aspects of the global food security situation. Among them, the logistical challenges imposed by the COVID-19 pandemic; the international rise in food prices, including as a result of ongoing conflicts, growing humanitarian needs and access barriers to assistance delivery; and the impact of trade policies, sanctions and unilateral measures in food security. Member States also exchanged views on possible measures to strengthen food security in countries

affected by conflict, namely the promotion of better early-warning systems, more resilient agrifood systems and adequate funding and access for humanitarian assistance.

145. On 15 September, an open briefing was held by the Security Council on conflict and food security, following the issuance of a white note by the Office for Coordination of Humanitarian Affairs on the risk of conflict-induced famine in Ethiopia, northern Nigeria, South Sudan and Yemen, in accordance with the mandate established by Security Council resolution [2417 \(2018\)](#). The Council was briefed by the Under-Secretary-General for Humanitarian Affairs and Emergency Relief Coordinator; the Executive Director of the World Food Programme, David Beasley; and the Chief Economist of the Food and Agriculture Organization, Maximo Torero. The briefers emphasized multiple challenges for improving food security, such as disruption of food systems, destruction of essential infrastructure for agricultural production, macroeconomic shocks and price- and access-related barriers for the provision of humanitarian assistance. Council members stressed the importance of advancing the framework created by resolution [2417 \(2018\)](#), utilizing white notes as early-warnings to promote action to avoid and reverse the risk of famine and ensuring the full implementation of the resolution, especially with regard to the unhindered delivery of humanitarian assistance and the respect for international humanitarian law. They also discussed possible ways to better promote food security and durable peace in conflict-affected countries. In this respect, member States highlighted the need to ensure accountability for violations of international humanitarian law and resolution [2417 \(2018\)](#) and to strengthen cooperation with regional organizations.

Climate and security in Africa

146. On 12 October, the Council held a high-level debate on the theme “Threats to international peace and security: climate and security in Africa”, chaired by the Minister for Foreign Affairs of Gabon, Michael Moussa Adamo. The meeting was focused on discussing climate change and peace and security in Africa.

Peacebuilding and sustaining peace

147. On 27 July, two representatives of the Peacebuilding Commission briefed the Council on peacebuilding and sustaining peace, the Permanent Representative of Egypt to the United Nations and Chair of the Peacebuilding Commission in 2021, Osama Abdelkhalek, and the Chargé d’Affaires of Bangladesh and current Chair of the Commission, Md Monwar

Hossain. The meeting on peacebuilding offered an opportunity to (a) provide the Council with an overview of the Peacebuilding Commission geographic engagements and thematic discussions in 2021 by presenting the annual report of the Commission; (b) present the 2022 programme of work of the Commission to members of the Council and (c) foster the debate on ways to improve and strengthen cooperation between the United Nations and the Commission.

Cooperation between the United Nations and regional and subregional organizations in maintaining international peace and security

148. On 23 March, the Security Council held a high-level open briefing on the theme “Cooperation between the United Nations and regional and subregional organizations in maintaining international peace and security (League of Arab States)” chaired by the Minister of State at the Ministry of Foreign Affairs and International Cooperation of the United Arab Emirates, Khalifa Shaheen Almarar. The Council was briefed by the Secretary-General; the Secretary-General of the League of Arab States, Ahmed Aboul Gheit; and a representative of civil society, Razan Alaqlil.

149. On 16 June, the Security Council met under the item “Cooperation between the United Nations and regional and subregional organizations in maintaining international peace and security (European Union)” chaired by the Minister for Europe and Foreign Affairs of Albania, Olta Xhaçka. The council was briefed by the High Representative of the European Union for Foreign Affairs and Security Policy and Vice-President of the European Commission, Josep Borrell.

150. On 11 October, the Council held a high-level debate on the cooperation between the United Nations and regional and subregional organizations in maintaining international peace and security (African Union), chaired by the Minister for Foreign Affairs of Gabon, Michael Moussa Adamo. The Council was briefed by the Secretary-General and the Chairperson of the African Union Commission, Moussa Faki Mahamat.

151. On 14 October, the Council held its sixteenth annual joint consultative meeting between members of the Security Council and those of the Peace and Security Council of the African Union. The meeting discussed issues on strengthening the African Union and United Nations peacekeeping in Africa, the situation in West Africa and the Sahel, the Great Lakes region, as well as application of sanctions in conflict situations in Africa. A joint communiqué was adopted on that occasion.

Working methods

152. On 28 June, the Council held its annual open debate on its working methods under the item entitled “Implementation of the note by the President of the Security Council ([S/2017/507](#))”. The discussion focused on a variety of topics, including on how to increase efficiency, effectiveness, transparency and inclusivity in the work of the Council, how to improve the fair distribution of penholdership and related working methods, how to ensure the full implementation of the note by the President, and the subsequent presidential notes, and the Council’s preparedness for future extraordinary circumstances, such as the COVID-19 pandemic. In this regard, the outgoing five elected members of the Council for 2022, India, Ireland, Kenya, Mexico and Norway transmitted a letter dated 29 December 2022 ([S/2022/1011](#)) on the working methods of the Security Council during the COVID-19 pandemic.
