Tenth emergency special session

Letter dated 19 October 2023 from the Secretary-General addressed to the President of the General Assembly

1. At present, four Member States are in arrears under the terms of Article 19 of the Charter of the United Nations, which states as follows:

A Member of the United Nations which is in arrears in the payment of its financial contributions to the Organization shall have no vote in the General Assembly if the amount of its arrears equals or exceeds the amount of the contributions due from it for the preceding two full years. The General Assembly may, nevertheless, permit such a Member to vote if it is satisfied that the failure to pay is due to conditions beyond the control of the Member.

2. The minimum payments necessary to reduce the amounts owed by those Member States on their contributions so that they remain below the gross amount assessed for the preceding two full years (2021 and 2022) are as follows:

Comoros ^a	347 285
Sao Tome and Principe ^a	824 824
Somalia ^a	1 248 433
Venezuela (Bolivarian Republic of)	76 172 014

^a In its resolution 78/2, the General Assembly decided that the Comoros, Sao Tome and Principe and Somalia should be permitted to vote in the Assembly until the end of its seventy-eighth session.
