## ARRANGEMENTS FOR THE DISPATCH OF A VISITING MISSION TO OBSERVE THE ELECTIONS TO THE PAPUA NEW GUINEA HOUSE OF ASSEMBLY IN 1972

Administrative financial implications of the draft resolutions  
contained in documents T/L.1167 and T/L.1168

Statement submitted by the Secretary-General in accordance with  
Rule 113.1 of the Financial Rules of the United Nations

1. Under the provisions of the draft resolution contained in document T/L.1167, and under the provision of the draft resolution contained in document T/L.1168, the Trusteeship Council would decide to send a Visiting Mission, composed of four members, to observe the elections to the Papua New Guinea House of Assembly in 1972. On the assumption that the Visiting Mission will remain in Papua New Guinea for a period of two weeks, the related financial implications would amount to an estimated \$25,300, of which \$21,100 would be for the travel and subsistence of the four members and of four accompanying supporting staff, \$3,000 for the charter of an aircraft in Papua New Guinea, and \$1,200 for miscellaneous supplies and services.
