## DRAFT RESOLUTIONS ON PETITIONS

Working paper prepared by the Secretariat

In accordance with the decision taken by the Trusteeship Council at the twenty-third meeting, on 23 March 1949, the Secretariat has prepared the following draft resolutions on petitions examined by the Council during its fifth session.

PETITION FROM THE SHARIFF IS-HAK COMMUNITY  
CONCERNING TANGANYIKA

Draft Resolution

The Trusteeship Council, acting under Article 87 b of the Charter, has, at its fifth session, in conformity with its rules of procedure, accepted and examined, in consultation with the United Kingdom as the Administering Authority concerned, a petition from the Shariff Is-Hak Community dated 7 September 1948 (T/PET.2/58).

Mr. J. E. S. Lamb was designated as the Special Representative of the Administering Authority for the examination of this petition.

The Council took note of the observations of the Administering Authority concerned (T/342) and of the statement of the Special Representative on this petition, which showed that the request of this Community for non-African status had been met by the passing of an ordinance which covered their case.

THE TRUSTEESHIP COUNCIL

HAVING NOTED that the petitioners' request has already been granted,  
DECIDES that no action by the Council is called for on this petition;

INVITES the Secretary-General to inform the Administering Authority and the petitioners of this resolution in accordance with rule 93 of the rules of procedure for the Trusteeship Council.

PETITION FROM MRS. KATE SALZMANN  
CONCERNING TANGANYIKA

Draft Resolution

The Trusteeship Council, acting under Article 87 (b) of the Charter, has at its fifth session, in conformity with its rules of procedure, accepted and examined in consultation with the United Kingdom as the Administering Authority concerned a petition from Mrs. Kate Salzmann, dated 6 December 1948 (T/PET.2/63).

The Council took note of the observations of the Administering Authority concerned (T/343), in which it stated that its action on the petitioner's case was in accordance with its repatriation policy which had been approved by the Trusteeship Council during its first session.<sup>1/</sup>

Having considered the observations presented by the Administering Authority on this petition,

J. Siggins, dated 23 February 1949 (T/PET.2/68 - T/PET.3/15).

The Council took note of the observations of the Belgian government (T/235), by which it informed the Council that no deposits of uranium had been discovered in Ruanda-Urundi.

PETITION FROM THE CONFERENCE OF FARMERS OF TOGOLAND  
UNDER UNITED KINGDOM TRUSTEESHIP CONCERNING  
TOGOLAND UNDER BRITISH ADMINISTRATION

The Trusteeship Council, acting under Article 87 b of the Charter, has, at its fifth session, in conformity with its rules of procedure, accepted and examined, in consultation with the United Kingdom as the Administering Authority concerned, a petition from the Conference of Farmers of Togoland under United Kingdom Trusteeship dated 1 April 1949 (T/PET.6/15).

The Council took note of the observations of the Administering Authority (T/358) on the questions raised in this petition.

PETITION FROM THE EXTERNAL TEACHERS' UNION CONCERNING

The Council took note of the observations of the Administering Authority (T/362) which maintained that the salary scales for external teachers were lower than those of certificated teachers because of the difference in the respective qualifications held.

DECIDES that it is unable to recommend that the Administering Authority reconsider its policy on this question;

INVITES the Secretary-General to inform the Administering Authority and the petitioners of this resolution in accordance with rule 93 of the rules of procedure for the Trusteeship Council.

PETITION FROM MR. AUGUSTINO DE SOUZA CONCERNING  
TOGOLAND UNDER FRENCH ADMINISTRATION

The Trusteeship Council, acting under Article 87 (b) of the Charter, has at its fifth session, in conformity with its rules of procedure, accepted and examined, in consultation with France as the Administering Authority concerned, a petition from Mr. Augustino de Souza, dated 2 May 1949 (T/PET.7/14).

THE TRUSTEESHIP COUNCIL,

NOTING that the questions raised in this petition are closely related to the questions raised in previous petitions from the Ewe people,

DECIDES to request the United Nations Visiting Mission to Trust Territories in West Africa to investigate the questions raised in this petition;

INVITES the Secretary-General to inform the Administering Authority and the petitioner of this resolution in accordance with Rule 93 of the rules of procedure for the Trusteeship Council.

PETITION FROM MRS. JANE T. WALLACE  
CONCERNING NEW GUINEA

Draft Resolution

The Trusteeship Council, acting under Article 87 b of the Charter, has, at its fifth session, in conformity with its rules of procedure, accepted and examined, in consultation with Australia as the Administering Authority concerned, a petition from Mrs. Jane T. Wallace dated 19 April 1949 (T/PET.8/1).

The Council took note of the observations of the Administering Authority (T/370); which stated that the petition referred to conditions in the territory as they existed prior to 1941.

THE TRUSTEESHIP COUNCIL

HAVING CONSIDERED the observations presented by the Administering Authority on this petition,

DECIDES that no particular action by the Council is called for on this petition;

INVITES the Secretary-General to transmit to the petitioner a copy of the conclusions and recommendations adopted by the Council as a result of its examination during its fifth session of the report of the Government of Australia on New Guinea for the year ended 30 June 1948 and to inform the Administering Authority and the petitioner of this resolution in accordance with rule 93 of the rules of procedure for the Trusteeship Council.

Mr. J. E. S. Lamb was designated as Special Representative of the Administering Authority for the examination of this petition.

Draft resolution

The Trusteeship Council, acting under Article 87 b of the Charter, has, at its fifth session, in conformity with its rules of procedure, accepted and examined, in consultation with Belgium as the Administering Authority concerned, a petition from Mr. G. Clement Ntilempaqa dated 18 August 1948 (T/PET.3/12).

The Council noted that, during its fourth session, it had adopted a resolution by which it informed the petitioner that the questions of a general character raised in his petition would be considered in conjunction with its examination at the fifth session of the reports of the United Nations Visiting Mission to East Africa.

The Trusteeship Council

Having adopted at its fifth session a resolution on the reports of the United Nations Visiting Mission to East Africa,

Decides to inform the petitioner that the questions of a general character raised in his petition have been and will be examined in connexion with its examination of the annual reports of the Administering Authority on the administration of the Territory;
