## **Election of one member of the Human Rights Committee to fill the vacancy created by the resignation of Farid Ahmadov (Azerbaijan), whose term was due to expire on 31 December 2026**

### **Note by the Secretary-General\***

1. In conformity with article 34 of the International Covenant on Civil and Political Rights, the forty-first meeting of States parties to the Covenant will be convened by the Secretary-General at United Nations Headquarters on 21 January 2025, for the purpose of electing one member of the Human Rights Committee from a list of persons nominated by States parties (para. 5) to replace the member who has resigned from the Committee.
2. In a letter dated 1 March 2024, Farid Ahmadov, who was elected at the thirty-ninth meeting of States parties to the Covenant, held on 17 June 2022, for a term that was due to expire on 31 December 2026, submitted his resignation from the Committee effective from 29 February 2024. Thereafter, the Chair of the Committee notified the Secretary-General of the resignation.
3. Pursuant to articles 33 (2) and 34 (1) of the Covenant, the Secretary-General declared the seat of Mr. Ahmadov vacant from the date on which the resignation took effect.
4. In accordance with article 34 (1) of the Covenant, the Secretary-General, in a note verbale dated 3 October 2024, invited the States parties to the Covenant to submit, in conformity with article 29 of the Covenant, their nominations for the election of one member of the Committee by 27 November 2024 for the purpose of filling the vacancy for a term expiring on 31 December 2026. All curricula vitae received by 27 November 2024 are included in the present document (see annex). Nominations received after that date will be issued in addenda to the present document.

As national focal point for the rights of refugees and stateless persons, I am also involved in the fight against gender-based violence, and I am an active member of the Association pour la Sauvegarde et la Protection des Enfants (Association for the Protection of Children). I have delivered presentations on behalf of Madagascar in international human rights forums in Geneva, The Hague and Dakar, promoting the exchange of best practices. My community involvement is reflected in my work with humanitarian associations to protect children and support the most vulnerable.
