Subject: **First day of issue, 6 October 2000: “World Heritage — Spain”
Stamps and prestige booklets**

Commemorative stamps

1. On Friday, 6 October 2000, the United Nations Postal Administration (UNPA) will issue a set of six commemorative stamps on the theme “World Heritage — Spain”.

2. This is the sixth United Nations stamp issue to illustrate World Heritage sites. It is the fourth in a series of stamps and prestige booklets focusing on either one specific World Heritage site or a group of World Heritage sites in one geographical location. The issuance of these stamps coincides with a stamp show and exhibition “Espana 2000” to be held in Madrid.

3. The stamps, in denominations of 33 cents, 60 cents, Sw F 1,00, Sw F 1,20, S 4.50/€0,33 and S 6.50/€0,47, were designed by Robert Stein (United Nations).

(United States equivalents — Sw F 1,00: \$0.60; Sw F 1,20: \$0.72; S 4.50/€ 0,33: \$0.31 and S 6.50/€0,47: \$0.44 subject to exchange rate fluctuation.)

Prestige booklets

4. Also on 6 October 2000, the United Nations Postal Administration will issue its fifth set of prestige booklets. The three booklets have a common design and each contains a total of 24 mint stamps in either United States, Swiss or Austrian denominations, based on the designs of the six commemorative stamps on the theme “World Heritage — Spain” in each booklet. The booklets are priced at \$2.40, Sw F 3,60 and S 36.

5. For the convenience of collectors, UNPA at Headquarters will provide prepared and cancelled New York, Geneva and Vienna first day covers on the UNPA official first day cachets **only**. Members of delegations and the staff can obtain these items on Friday, 6 October 2000, at the following locations:

(a) The UNPA sales counter in the concourse of the General Assembly Building, from 9 a.m. to 5.30 p.m.;

(b) The counter at the north end of the Secretariat lobby, from 9 a.m. to 4.30 p.m.

6. First day of issue cancellations can be obtained at a temporary United States Postal Service substation located outside the United Nations Bookshop in the concourse of the General Assembly Building from 9 a.m. to 5.30 p.m.
