Summary statement by the Secretary-General on matters of which the Security Council is seized and on the stage reached in their consideration

Addendum

Pursuant to rule 11 of the provisional rules of procedure of the Security Council, the Secretary-General is submitting the following summary statement.

The list of items of which the Security Council is seized is contained in document S/2001/15 of 19 March 2001.

During the week ending 13 January 2001, the Security Council took action on the following items:

The situation in Somalia (*see* S/23370/Add.11, 16, 30, 34 and 48; S/25070/Add.12, 23, 38, 43 and 46; S/1994/20/Add.4, 21, 33, 38 and 43; S/1995/40/Add.13; S/1996/15/Add.3, 10 and 50; S/1997/40/Add.8, 16 and 51; S/1999/25/Add.20 and 44; and S/2000/40/Add.25 and 36; *see also* S/23370/Add.3)

The Security Council resumed its consideration of the item at its 4254th meeting, held in private on 11 January 2001 in accordance with the understanding reached in its prior consultations.

At the close of the meeting, the following communiqué was issued by the Secretary-General in accordance with rule 55 of the provisional rules of procedure of the Council:

“At its 4254th meeting, held in private on 11 January 2001, the Security Council considered the item entitled ‘The situation in Somalia’.

“In accordance with the understanding reached in the Council’s prior consultations, His Excellency Mr. Ali Khalif Galaydh, Prime Minister of the Transitional National Government of Somalia, was invited to participate in the discussion.

“The representative of Djibouti was invited, at his request, to participate in accordance with rule 37 of the Council’s provisional rules of procedure.

“The Security Council heard a briefing by His Excellency Mr. Ali Khalif Galaydh.



“The members of the Council made comments and posed questions in connection with the briefing.

“Prime Minister Galaydh responded to the comments and questions posed by members of the Council.”

The Security Council resumed its consideration of the item at its 4255th meeting, held on 11 January 2001 in accordance with the understanding reached in its prior consultations, having before it the report of the Secretary-General on the situation in Somalia (S/2000/1211).

The President stated that, following consultations of the Council, he had been authorized to make a statement on behalf of the Council and read out the text of that statement (for the text, see S/PRST/2001/1; to be issued in *Official Records of the Security Council, Fifty-sixth Year, Resolutions and Decisions of the Security Council, 2001*).

The Security Council resumed its consideration of the item at its 4256th meeting, held on 12 January 2001 in accordance with the understanding reached in its prior consultations, having before it the report of the Secretary-General on the United Nations Mission of Observers in Prevlaka (S/2000/1251).

The President, with the consent of the Council, invited the representative of Croatia, at his request, to participate in the discussion without the right to vote.

The President drew attention to a draft resolution (S/2001/34) which had been prepared in the course of the Council's prior consultations.

The Security Council proceeded to vote on draft resolution S/2001/34, and adopted it unanimously as resolution 1335 (2001) (for the text, see S/RES/1335 (2001); to be issued in *Official Records of the Security Council, Fifty-sixth Year, Resolutions and Decisions of the Security Council, 2001*).
