**Extension of the first country cooperation framework
for Tuvalu**

Note by the Administrator

Period of extension:

1 January 2002 through 31 December 2002

I. Background and justification

1. At its third regular session 1997, the Executive Board approved the first country cooperation framework (CCF) for Tuvalu, for the period 1997 to 2001. A one-year extension of the first CCF has been requested, to enable the formulation of the second CCF within the context of the United Nations Development Framework and to synchronize the period of the second CCF with the programming cycles of other United Nations agencies in the country.

2. The main thematic areas of the first CCF are good governance, with an emphasis on public sector reform, sustainable livelihoods, through job creation, especially in rural and subsistence sectors, and investment and business development.

II. Objectives

3. UNDP will continue to support the Government's efforts to promote good governance, through strengthening local governance structures and the

empowerment of outer islands communities to determine and manage their own development. Emphasis will also continue to be placed on the areas of gender mainstreaming, job creation, and support towards sustainable livelihoods and the development of a social welfare services policy.

III. Recommendation

4. The Administrator wishes to inform the Executive Board that he has approved the extension of the first country cooperation framework for Tuvalu for a period of one year, 1 January 2002 through 31 December 2002.
