I am pleased to present my compliments and to refer to your letter dated 12 July 2001, in response to a request for a waiver of the travel ban imposed by paragraph 7 of United Nations Security Council resolution 1343 (2001) to allow the Ministers for Foreign Affairs and Finance to travel to Freetown, Sierra Leone, on 14 July 2001 to attend the World Cup qualifying soccer match between Liberia and Sierra Leone.

I was taken aback to learn that the Committee did not grant favourable consideration to the request. Apparently, the Committee did not recognize the nuances of the visit and its implication for the improvement in the relationship among members of the Mano River Union and the promotion of dialogue.

The soccer match was not the primary motivation for the proposed visit but rather it provided an opportunity for confidence-building and dialogue. It is my considered opinion that the Council's rejection of the Government's request runs contrary to the spirit of resolution 1343 (2001) and the search for sustainable peace within the Mano River Union.

It is the hope of the Liberian Government that the Committee did not view the Government's request solely in the context of a soccer match. Despite the Committee's position, the Government of Liberia will continue to pursue dialogue and other avenues of improving its relationship with its neighbours.
