Election of 24 experts to the Committee on Energy and Natural Resources for Development

Note by the Secretary-General

1. Pursuant to resolutions 1998/46 and 1998/47 of 31 July 1998, the Economic and Social Council is to elect, at its resumed organizational session for 2002, 24 experts to the Committee on Energy and Natural Resources for Development for a four-year term beginning on 1 January 2003.
2. The 24 seats are distributed among two subgroups of 12 experts each, nominated by Governments and approved by the Council. One subgroup deals with issues relating to energy and the other subgroup deals with issues relating to water resources.
3. In accordance with the above-mentioned resolutions, the terms of office of all members run concurrently and according to the following geographical distribution:
 - Six members from African States;
 - Five members from Asian States;
 - Three members from Eastern European States;
 - Four members from Latin American and Caribbean States;
 - Six members from Western European and other States.
4. The membership of the Committee in 2002 is given in the annex to the present note.
