SUMMARY STATEMENT BY THE SECRETARY-GENERAL OF MATTERS OF WHICH THE
SECURITY COUNCIL IS SEIZED AND OF THE STAGE REACHED
IN THEIR CONSIDERATION

Pursuant to Rule 11 of the Provisional Rules of Procedure of the Security Council, I submit the following summary statement of matters of which the Security Council is seized and of the stage reached in their consideration on 24 October 1947:

1. The Iranian Question (see document S/576);
2. Special Agreements under Article 43 and the Organization of the Armed Forces made available to the Security Council (see document S/576);
3. Rules of Procedure of the Security Council (see document S/576);
4. Statute and Rules of Procedure of the Military Staff Committee (see document S/576);
5. Rules governing the admission of new Members (see document S/576);
6. The General Regulation and Reduction of Armaments and Information on Armed Forces of the United Nations (see document S/576);
7. Appointment of a Governor of the Free Territory of Trieste (see document S/576);
8. The Egyptian Question (see document S/576);
9. The Indonesian Question (see documents S/576 and S/584).

The discussion was continued at the two hundred and twelfth and two hundred and thirteenth meetings on 20 and 22 October. A new draft resolution (document S/585) was introduced by the representative of the United States, and the representative of Australia altered his previously presented draft resolution (document S/579/Rev.1). The report by the Consular Commission at Batavia to the Security Council was circulated as document S/586.

The Council decided to postpone further discussion until Monday, 27 October, in order to study the full Report by the Consular Commission at Batavia.
