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Summary statement by the Secretary-General on matters of which the Security Council is seized and on the stage reached in their consideration

Addendum

Pursuant to rule 11 of the provisional rules of procedure of the Security Council, the Secretary-General is submitting the following summary statement.

The list of items of which the Security Council is seized is contained in documents S/2002/30 of 15 March 2002, S/2002/30/Add.1 of 22 March 2002, S/2002/30/Add.2 of 25 March 2002, S/2002/30/Add.3 of 26 March 2002, S/2002/30/Add.5 of 1 April 2002 and S/2002/30/Add.13 of 9 April 2002.

During the week ending 25 May 2002, the Security Council took action on the following items:

The situation in East Timor (*see* S/11593/Add.50 and 51; S/11935/Add.15 and 16; S/1999/25/Add.17, 22, 25, 30, 33-36, 42 and 50; S/2000/40/Add.4, 11, 16, 20, 25, 29, 30, 34, 35, 37, 38, 40 and 46-48; S/2001/15/Add.4, 5, 14, 20, 31, 34, 37 and 44; and S/2002/30/Add.4, 16, 17 and 19; *see also* S/2001/15/Add.43; and S/2002/30/Add.3 and 18)

The Security Council resumed its consideration of the item at its 4537th meeting, held on 20 May 2002 in accordance with the understanding reached in its prior consultations, having before it the report of the Secretary-General on the United Nations Transitional Administration in East Timor (S/2002/432 and Add.1).

The President, with the consent of the Council, invited the representatives of Australia, Brazil, Brunei Darussalam, Costa Rica, Cuba, Indonesia, Jamaica, Japan, Malaysia, Nepal, New Zealand, the Philippines, Portugal, the Republic of Korea, Spain, Thailand, Ukraine and Venezuela, at their request, to participate in the discussion without the right to vote.

The President stated that, following consultations of the Council, he had been authorized to make a statement on behalf of the Council and read out the text of that statement (for the text, *see* S/PRST/2002/13; to be issued in *Official Records of the Security Council, Fifty-seventh Year, Resolutions and Decisions of the Security Council, 2002*).

The situation in Africa (*see* S/1997/40/Add.38; S/1998/44/Add.15, 16, 21, 37, 38, 46 and 48; S/1999/25/Add.37, 38 and 49; S/2000/40/Add.1 and 4; and S/2002/30/Add.4; *see also* S/2000/40/Add.35; and S/2001/15/Add.10 and 12)

The Security Council resumed its consideration of the item at its 4538th meeting, held on 22 May 2002 in accordance with the understanding reached in its prior consultations. There was one suspension and one resumption of the meeting.

The President, with the consent of the Council, invited the representatives of Algeria, Angola, Australia, Bahrain, Bangladesh, Benin, Burundi, Costa Rica, Côte d'Ivoire, Cuba, Djibouti, Egypt, Gabon, the Gambia, India, Japan, the Libyan Arab Jamahiriya, Malawi, Mali, Morocco, Mozambique, Nepal, Nigeria, Pakistan, the Republic of Korea, Rwanda, Senegal, Sierra Leone, Somalia, South Africa, Spain, Tunisia, Ukraine, the United Republic of Tanzania and Zambia, at their request, to participate in the discussion without the right to vote.

In accordance with the understanding reached in the Council's prior consultations, the President, with the consent of the Council, extended invitations under rule 39 of the Council's provisional rules of procedure to Jagdish Dharamchand Koonjul, Chairman of the ad hoc Working Group on Conflict Prevention and Resolution in Africa, and Ivan Šimonović, President of the Economic and Social Council.

In response to the request contained in a letter dated 20 May 2002 from the Permanent Representative of Mauritius to the United Nations (S/2002/554), the President, with the consent of the Council, extended an invitation under rule 39 of the Council's provisional rules of procedure to Amadou Kébé, Permanent Observer of the Organization of African Unity to the United Nations.

The meeting was suspended.

Upon the resumption of the meeting, the President, with the consent of the Council, invited the representatives of Cape Verde, the Central African Republic, Ethiopia and Malaysia, at their request, to participate in the discussion without the right to vote.

The Security Council resumed its consideration of the item at its 4539th meeting, held on 22 May 2002 in accordance with the understanding reached in its prior consultations.

The President stated that, following consultations of the Council, he had been authorized to make a statement on behalf of the Council and read out the text of that statement (for the text, *see* S/PRST/2002/14; to be issued in *Official Records of the Security Council, Fifty-seventh Year, Resolutions and Decisions of the Security Council, 2002*).

Admission of new Members

By a note dated 20 May 2002 (S/2002/558), the Secretary-General circulated the application of the Democratic Republic of East Timor for admission to membership in the United Nations, contained in a letter dated 20 May 2002 from the President and the Prime Minister of the Democratic Republic of East Timor to the Secretary-General.

The Security Council considered the application of the Democratic Republic of East Timor for membership in the United Nations at its 4540th meeting, held on 22 May 2002.

At that meeting, in accordance with the provisions of rule 59 of the provisional rules of procedure of the Security Council and in the absence of a proposal to the contrary, the Council decided that the President of the Security Council would refer the application of the Democratic Republic of East Timor to the Committee on the Admission of New Members for examination and report.

At its 4542nd meeting, held on 23 May 2002, the Security Council had before it the report of the Committee on the Admission of New Members concerning the application of the Democratic Republic of East Timor for admission to membership in the United Nations (S/2002/566), in which the Committee recommended to the Council the adoption of a draft resolution on the application of the Democratic Republic of East Timor for admission to membership in the United Nations.

At the same meeting, in accordance with the understanding reached in prior consultations among members of the Council and upon the proposal of the President, the Security Council adopted without a vote the draft resolution contained in paragraph 3 of the report as resolution 1414 (2002) (for the text, see S/RES/1414 (2002); to be issued in *Official Records of the Security Council, Fifty-seventh Year, Resolutions and Decisions of the Security Council, 2002*).

The President stated that he would convey the decision of the Security Council recommending the admission of the Democratic Republic of East Timor to membership in the United Nations to the Secretary-General for transmittal to the General Assembly, in accordance with the provisions of rule 60 of the Council's provisional rules of procedure.

The President also stated that, following consultations of the Council, he had been authorized to make a statement on behalf of the Council and read out the text of that statement (for the text, see S/PRST/2002/15; to be issued in *Official Records of the Security Council, Fifty-seventh Year, Resolutions and Decisions of the Security Council, 2002*).

The Security Council resumed its consideration of the item at its 4541st meeting, held on 23 May 2002 in accordance with the understanding reached in its prior consultations.

The President, with the consent of the Council, invited the representatives of Afghanistan, Canada, India, the Islamic Republic of Iran, Japan, New Zealand, Pakistan, Spain and Turkey, at their request, to participate in the discussion without the right to vote.

In accordance with the understanding reached in the Council's prior consultations, the President, with the consent of the Council, extended an invitation under rule 39 of the Council's provisional rules of procedure to Kieran Prendergast, Under-Secretary-General for Political Affairs.

The President drew attention to a draft resolution (S/2002/569) that had been prepared in the course of the Council's prior consultations.

The Security Council proceeded to vote on draft resolution S/2002/569, and adopted it unanimously as resolution 1413 (2002) (for the text, see S/RES/1413 (2002); to be issued in *Official Records of the Security Council, Fifty-seventh Year, Resolutions and Decisions of the Security Council, 2002*).

The Security Council resumed its consideration of the item at its 4543rd meeting, held on 24 May 2002 in accordance with the understanding reached in its prior consultations.

The President, with the consent of the Council, invited the representatives of Germany, Italy, the former Yugoslav Republic of Macedonia and Yugoslavia, at their request, to participate in the discussion without the right to vote.

The Security Council resumed its consideration of the item at its 4545th (private) meeting, held on 24 May 2002 in accordance with the understanding reached in its prior consultations.

At the close of the 4545th meeting, in accordance with rule 55 of the provisional rules of procedure of the Security Council, the following communiqué was issued through the Secretary-General in place of a verbatim record:

“On 24 May 2002, the Security Council, pursuant to annex II, section A, of resolution 1353 (2001), held its 4545th meeting in private with the troop-contributing countries to the United Nations Disengagement Observer Force (UNDOF).

“The Security Council and the troop-contributing countries heard a briefing under rule 39 of its provisional rules of procedure by Louise Laheurte, Deputy Director of the Asia and Middle East Division of the Department of Peacekeeping Operations.

“The members of the Council had a constructive exchange of views with representatives of participating troop-contributing countries.”
