Summary statement by the Secretary-General on matters of which the Security Council is seized and on the stage reached in their consideration

Addendum

Pursuant to rule 11 of the provisional rules of procedure of the Security Council, the Secretary-General is submitting the following summary statement.

The list of items of which the Security Council is seized is contained in documents S/2002/30 of 15 March 2002, S/2002/30/Add.1 of 22 March 2002, S/2002/30/Add.2 of 25 March 2002, S/2002/30/Add.3 of 26 March 2002, S/2002/30/Add.5 of 1 April 2002, S/2002/30/Add.13 of 9 April 2002 and S/2002/30/Add.23 of 21 June 2002.

During the week ending 29 June 2002, the Security Council took action on the following items:

Security Council resolutions 1160 (1998), 1199 (1998), 1203 (1998), 1239 (1999) and 1244 (1999) (*see* S/1999/25/Add.43 and 51; S/2000/40/Add.6, 9, 18, 22, 27, 33, 38, 45, 46 and 50; S/2001/15/Add.3, 7, 10, 11, 15, 25, 30, 35, 40, 45 and 48; and S/2002/30/Add.3, 6, 8, 12, 16, 19 and 20; *see also* S/1998/44/Add.13, 34, 37, 38 and 42; S/1999/25/Add.2, 3, 11, 18 and 22; and S/2001/15/Add.3, 6, 17, 33 and 37-39)

The Security Council resumed its consideration of the item at its 4559th meeting, held on 26 June 2002 in accordance with the understanding reached in its prior consultations.

The President, with the consent of the Council, invited the representatives of Spain and the Federal Republic of Yugoslavia, at their request, to participate in the discussion without the right to vote.

In accordance with the understanding reached in the Council's prior consultations, the President, with the consent of the Council, extended an invitation under rule 39 of the Council's provisional rules of procedure to Jean-Marie Guéhenno, Under-Secretary-General for Peacekeeping Operations.

The situation in Afghanistan (see S/1994/20/Add.3, 11, 31 and 47; S/1996/15/Add.6, 14, 38, 41 and 42; S/1997/40/Add.15, 27 and 50; S/1998/44/Add.14, 28, 31, 34, 37 and 49; S/1999/25/Add.33, 40 and 41; S/2000/40/Add.13 and 50; S/2001/15/Add.23, 31, 46, 49 and 51; and S/2002/30/Add.2, 4, 5, 8, 10, 12, 16, 20 and 24; *see also* S/19420/Add.44; S/20370/Add.14-16; and S/21100/Add.1)

The Security Council resumed its consideration of the item at its 4560th meeting, held on 26 June 2002 in accordance with the understanding reached in its prior consultations.

The President, with the consent of the Council, invited the representative of Afghanistan, at his request, to participate in the discussion without the right to vote.

The President drew attention to a draft resolution (S/2002/703) that had been prepared in the course of the Council's prior consultations.

The Security Council proceeded to vote on draft resolution S/2002/703, and adopted it unanimously as resolution 1419 (2002) (for the text, see S/RES/1419 (2002); to be issued in *Official Records of the Security Council, Fifty-seventh Year, Resolutions and Decisions of the Security Council, 2002*).

Threats to international peace and security caused by terrorist acts (see S/2001/15/Add.37, 39 and 46; and S/2002/30/Add.15; *see also* S/1998/44/Add.32)

The Security Council resumed its consideration of the item at its 4561st meeting, held on 27 June 2002 in accordance with the understanding reached in its prior consultations.

The President, with the consent of the Council, invited the representatives of Brunei Darussalam, Costa Rica and Spain, at their request, to participate in the discussion without the right to vote.

In accordance with the understanding reached in the Council's prior consultations, the President, with the consent of the Council, extended an invitation under rule 39 of the Council's provisional rules of procedure to Sir Jeremy Greenstock, Chairman of the Security Council Committee established pursuant to resolution 1373 (2001) concerning counter-terrorism.

Wrap-up discussion on the work of the Security Council for the current month (see S/2001/15/Add.35, 48 and 51; and S/2002/30/Add.4, 8 and 21; *see also* S/2001/15/Add.26)

The Security Council resumed its consideration of the item at its 4562nd (private) meeting, held on 28 June 2002 in accordance with the understanding reached in its prior consultations.

At the close of the meeting, in accordance with rule 55 of the provisional rules of procedure of the Security Council, the following communiqué was issued through the Secretary-General in place of a verbatim record:

“At its 4562nd meeting, held in private on 28 June 2002 at 10.50 a.m., the Security Council considered the item entitled ‘Wrap-up discussion on the work of the Security Council for the current month’.

“The President, with the consent of the Council, invited the representatives of Bahrain, Egypt, Spain and Ukraine to participate in the discussion of the item without the right to vote in accordance with the relevant

provisions of the Charter and rule 37 of the Council's provisional rules of procedure.

“The members of the Council and the representatives invited under rule 37 of the Council's provisional rules of procedure had a constructive discussion.”
