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Summary statement by the Secretary-General on matters of which the Security Council is seized and on the stage reached in their consideration

Addendum

Pursuant to rule 11 of the provisional rules of procedure of the Security Council, the Secretary-General is submitting the following summary statement.

During the week ending 19 October 2002, the Security Council took action on the following items:

Threats to international peace and security caused by terrorist acts (*see* S/2001/15/Add.37, 39 and 46; and S/2002/30/Add.2, 15, 25, 39 and 40; *see also* S/1998/44/Add.32)

The Security Council resumed its consideration of the item at its 4624th meeting, held on 14 October 2002 in accordance with the understanding reached in its prior consultations.

The President drew attention to a draft resolution (S/2002/1145) that had been prepared in the course of the Council's prior consultations.

The Security Council proceeded to vote on draft resolution S/2002/1145 and adopted it unanimously as resolution 1438 (2002) (for the text, see S/RES/1438 (2002); to be issued in *Official Records of the Security Council, Resolutions and Decisions of the Security Council, 1 August 2002-31 July 2003*).

The situation between Iraq and Kuwait (*see* S/21100/Add.30-33, 36-38, 42, 43 and 47; S/22110/Add.6-9, 13, 14, 17, 20, 24, 25, 32, 37 and 40; S/23370/Add.8, 11, 28, 34 and 39; S/25070/Add.1, 2, 5, 21, 24 and Corr.1, 26 and 47; S/1994/20/Add.8, 39-41 and 45; S/1995/40/Add.14; S/1996/15/Add.11, 12, 23 and 33; S/1997/40/Add.15, 22-24, 36, 42, 43, 45, 48 and 51; S/1998/44/Add.2, 7, 9, 12, 19, 24, 36, 44, 47 and 50; S/1999/25/Add.19, 39, 45 and 47-49; S/2000/40/Add.11, 12, 22 and 48; S/2001/15/Add.22, 26, 27 and 48; and S/2002/30/Add.19; *see also* S/23370/Add.10, 32, 35 and 47; S/2001/15/Add.40; and S/2002/30/Add.39)

By a letter dated 10 October 2002 addressed to the President of the Security Council (S/2002/1132), the Permanent Representative of South Africa, on behalf of the Non-Aligned Movement, referred to his letter dated 3 October (S/2002/1108) and requested the convening of an emergency open debate on the situation in Iraq, so that the Security Council could hear the views of the wider United Nations membership before it adopted a possible new resolution on Iraq.

The Security Council resumed its consideration of the item at its 4625th meeting, held on 16 and 17 October 2002 in response to the above request. There were three suspensions and three resumptions of the meeting.

On 16 October 2003, the President, with the consent of the Council, invited the representatives of Albania, Algeria, Angola, Argentina, Australia, Bangladesh, Belarus, Brazil, Canada, Chile, Costa Rica, Cuba, Denmark, Djibouti, Egypt, India, Indonesia, the Islamic Republic of Iran, Iraq, Japan, Jordan, Kuwait, the Lao People's Democratic Republic, Lebanon, the Libyan Arab Jamahiriya, Liechtenstein, Malaysia, Morocco, Nepal, New Zealand, Nigeria, Oman, Pakistan, Peru, Saudi Arabia, Senegal, South Africa, the Sudan, Switzerland, Thailand, Tunisia, Turkey, Ukraine, the United Arab Emirates, Viet Nam and Yemen, at their request, to participate in the discussion without the right to vote.

In response to the request contained in a letter dated 15 October 2002 from the Permanent Observer of Palestine to the United Nations addressed to the President of the Security Council (S/2002/1147), the President, in accordance with the rules of procedure and the previous practice in that regard, invited the Permanent Observer of Palestine to participate in the discussion.

In response to the request contained in a letter dated 14 October 2002 from the Permanent Representative of the Syrian Arab Republic to the United Nations (S/2002/1140), the President extended an invitation under rule 39 of the Council's provisional rules of procedure to Yahya Mahmassani, Permanent Observer of the League of Arab States to the United Nations.

In response to the request contained in a letter dated 15 October 2002 from the Permanent Representative of the Sudan to the United Nations (S/2002/1148), the President extended an invitation under rule 39 of the Council's provisional rules of procedure to Mokhtar Lamani, Permanent Observer of the Organization of the Islamic Conference to the United Nations.

The meeting was suspended.

Upon the resumption of the meeting on the same date, the President, with the consent of the Council, invited the representatives of Cambodia, Jamaica, Qatar, Sri Lanka and Zimbabwe, at their request, to participate in the discussion without the right to vote.

Upon the resumption of the meeting, on 17 October 2002, the President, with the consent of the Council, invited the representative of Mauritania, at his request, to participate in the discussion without the right to vote.

The Security Council resumed its consideration of the item at its 4628th meeting, held on 18 October 2002 in accordance with the understanding reached in its prior consultations. The President drew attention to a letter dated 14 October 2002 from the Chairman of the Security Council Committee established pursuant to resolution 864 (1993) concerning the situation in Angola, transmitting the report of the Monitoring Mechanism on Sanctions against UNITA (S/2002/1119).

The President, with the consent of the Council, invited the representative of Angola, at his request, to participate in the discussion without the right to vote.

The President drew attention to a draft resolution (S/2002/1168) that had been submitted by Bulgaria, France, Ireland, Norway, the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Northern Ireland and the United States of America.

The Security Council proceeded to vote on draft resolution S/2002/1168 and adopted it unanimously as resolution 1439 (2002) (for the text, see S/RES/1439 (2002); to be issued in *Official Records of the Security Council, Resolutions and Decisions of the Security Council, 1 August 2002-31 July 2003*).
