**Extensions of country cooperation frameworks**

**Note of the Administrator**

*Summary*

Using the streamlined format introduced at the first regular session 2002 of the Executive Board, the present note contains information on the first one-year extensions of the second country cooperation frameworks (CCFs) for Angola, the former Yugoslav Republic of Macedonia, Mauritius, Tajikistan, Uruguay and Zimbabwe, as well as a request for the approval of the two-year extension of the second CCF for Georgia. The Governments concerned requested the extensions.

In accordance with established procedures, the Administrator approves the first one-year extension of CCFs while the second-year or two-year extensions are submitted to the Board for its approval. Table 1 presents information on the first one-year CCF extensions approved by the Administrator. Table 2 summarizes the reasons given for requesting a two-year extension of the second CCF for Georgia.

The Executive Board may wish to take note of the first extensions of the second CCFs for Angola, the former Yugoslav Republic of Macedonia, Mauritius, Tajikistan, Uruguay and Zimbabwe, for a period of one year, from 1 January 2004 to 31 December 2004, and approve the extension of the second CCF for Georgia for a period of two years, from 1 January 2004 to 31 December 2005.
