Statement of the Coordinating Bureau of the Non-Aligned Movement on the bomb attack on the headquarters of the United Nations Mission in Baghdad on 19 August 2003

Members of the Non-Aligned Movement are deeply shocked and dismayed by the bomb attack against the headquarters of the United Nations Mission in Baghdad on 19 August 2003, which has killed 17 people, including Mr. Sergio Vieira de Mello, Special Representative of the Secretary-General for Iraq, as well as injuring many others. The Movement extends its sincere condolences and deepest sympathies to the victims, bereaved families and other affected individuals as a result of the attack.

While condemning this attack in the strongest possible terms, the Movement believes that such attacks cannot break the will of the international community to continue to extend all possible assistance to the Iraqi people to regain their national sovereignty.

Despite this attack, the Movement is convinced that the United Nations should continue to play its role in Iraq through the United Nations Assistance Mission in Iraq (UNAMI). The Movement encourages the States Members of the United Nations and the Secretary-General to remain steadfast in this regard.

The Movement welcomes the statements by the Security Council and the Secretary-General condemning the attack. The Movement reiterates its pledge to support the Secretary-General and the men and women who have dedicated their lives to the service of the United Nations in various missions all over the world. The Movement calls for enhanced security arrangements for them so that they can fulfil their mandate peacefully.

The Movement regards the attack not simply as an attack against the United Nations and its institutions but also as a despicable act of terror against the people of Iraq and the international community as a whole as well as against the principles that we stand for.

The Movement demands that the United Nations and its missions not be made targets for attacks by any party. Such attacks directed against the people and institution whose only aim is to assist the people of Iraq and others elsewhere deserve the strongest condemnation of the whole international community.
