REPORT BY THE SECRETARY-GENERAL ON THE SITUATION  
IN THE DOMINICAN REPUBLIC

Addendum

1. The following information on the withdrawal of the Inter-American Peace Force from the Dominican Republic has been received from the office of my Representative there since the publication of my last report on the subject (S/7338/Add.8) on 22 August 1966.
2. On 20 August, the United States cargo ship "Yancey" left the military port of Haina with approximately 600 tons of military and office equipment and the following personnel of the United States contingent of IAPF: four men of the 7th Special Forces; three men of the 42nd Medical Hospital; five men of the 523rd Engineer Battalion; three men of the 524th Personnel Service Company; one man of the 627th Supply and Service Battalion; and three men of the 491st Transport Terminal Service.
3. On 22 August, the remainder of the Honduran contingent, consisting of five officers and 110 men, departed by ship from Haina, leaving one man behind to represent the contingent.
4. On 22 August, 170 personnel of the Nicaraguan contingent, representing the whole of this contingent less one man, who has stayed behind as the representative of the contingent, were withdrawn. Of these, one officer and eleven men left by ship from Haina and 158 by air from San Isidro Air Base.
