REPORT BY THE SECRETARY-GENERAL ON THE SITUATION  
IN THE DOMINICAN REPUBLIC

Addendum

1. The following information on the withdrawal of the Inter-American Peace Force from the Dominican Republic has been received from the office of my Representative there since the publication of my last report on the subject (S/7338/Add.10) on 1 September 1966.
2. The withdrawal of IAPF is reported to be proceeding according to schedule. Further United States personnel and equipment left the country during the period from 1 to 6 September.
3. On 1 September, five officers and twenty-six men departed by air from San Isidro Air Base. They consisted of one officer and six men of the IAPF headquarters, one officer and five men of the headquarters of the United States forces in the Dominican Republic, one man of the 13th Criminal Investigation Detachment, one officer of the 16th General Support Group, three men of the 81st United States Army Band, six men of the 218th Military Police Company, two men of the 508th Airborne Battalion, two men of the 524th Personnel Service Company, one man of the 539th Army Postal Unit, one officer of the 627th Supply and Service Battalion and one officer of the 681st Intelligence Corps Detachment.
4. On 4 September, one man of the 206th Signal Company and six men of the 218th Military Police Company left by air from San Isidro Air Base.
5. On 5 September, five men of the United States Army Special Security Detachment and two men of the United States forces in the Dominican Republic also left by air from San Isidro Air Base.
6. On 6 September, the United States freighter Cibao sailed from the military port of Haina with 300 tons of cargo and equipment.
