THE DOMINICAN REPUBLIC

Addendum

1. The following information on the withdrawal of further units of the Inter-American Peace Force from the Dominican Republic has been communicated to the office of my Representative there by IAPF Headquarters since the publication of my last report on the subject (S/7538/Add.13) on 17 September 1966.
2. On 18 September, 73 military personnel left by air from San Isidro Air Base. They consisted of 19 members of the 61st Army Band, 1 of the 524th Personnel Service Company, 14 of the United States Forces in the Dominican Republic, 2 of the 42nd Field Hospital, 27 of the 206th Signal Company, 2 of the 218th Military Police Company, 3 of the 248th Military Police Detachment and 5 of the 2nd Battalion, 508th Infantry Regiment.
3. On the same day, a further group of 381 personnel departed by sea aboard the U.S.S. De Soto County. This group was made up of 4 members of the United States Army Support Element, 165 of Headquarters and Headquarters Company, 2nd Battalion, 508th Infantry Regiment, 111 of B Company of the same regiment, and 1 of the 864th Ordnance Detachment.
4. On 19 September, 130 military personnel left by air from San Isidro Air Base. They consisted of 1 member of IAPF Headquarters, 13 of the United States Air Force in the Dominican Republic, 6 of the 13th Public Information Detachment, 3 of the 61st Army Band, 44 of Headquarters, United States Forces in the Dominican Republic, 7 of the 206th Signal Company, 5 of the 2nd Battalion, 508th Infantry Regiment, 14 of the 218th Military Police Company, 7 of the 524th Personnel Service Company, 1 of the 681st Intelligence Corps Detachment, 4 of the 104th Finance Detachment, 20 of the United States Army Strategic Communications Command, 2 of the 491st Transport Detachment and 3 of the 539th Army Postal Unit.

5. Also on 19 September, 590 military personnel left by sea on the U.S.S. Hermitage and the U.S.S. Wood County. They consisted of 7 members of the 27<sup>th</sup> Medical Detachment, 135 of the 205<sup>th</sup> Signal Company, 8 of the 218<sup>th</sup> Military Police Company, 6 of the 283<sup>rd</sup> Aviation Company, 29 of the 546<sup>th</sup> Transport Company, 16 of the United States Army Strategic Communications Command, 17 of the United States Army Support Element, 94 of the 105<sup>th</sup> Transport Company, 2 of the 489<sup>th</sup> Transport Company, 4 of the 490<sup>th</sup> Transport Company, 11 of the 491<sup>st</sup> Transport Company, 4 of the 42<sup>nd</sup> Field Hospital, 124 of A Company, 2<sup>nd</sup> Battalion of the 508<sup>th</sup> Infantry Regiment, 6 of C Company of the same regiment, 3 of the 67<sup>th</sup> Maintenance Battalion, 22 of the 16<sup>th</sup> General Support Group, 6 of the 285<sup>th</sup> Engineer Detachment, 23 of the 649<sup>th</sup> Supply and Service Company and 5 of the 627<sup>th</sup> Supply and Service Company.

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
