LETTER DATED 7 DECEMBER 1965 FROM THE PERMANENT REPRESENTATIVE OF INDIA
ADDRESSED TO THE SECRETARY-GENERAL

I have the honour to communicate the following further cease-fire violations and other incidents created by Pakistan:

Jammu and Kashmir

Keran Sector

1. Pakistani troops fired medium machine-guns, 3-inch and 81 mm mortars on two of our posts in an area twenty-six miles east-north-east of Keran on 1 December 1965.
2. Pakistani troops directed 81 mm mortar fire towards two of our posts in an area ten and fourteen miles east-north-east of Keran on 2 December 1965.
3. Pakistani troops directed 81 mm mortar fire towards our post in an area thirteen miles east-north-east of Keran on 3 December 1965.

Tithwal Sector

4. Fifteen Pakistani troops were seen digging trenches in an area five and a quarter miles south-west of Tithwal, from 0800 hours to 1230 hours on 2 December 1965.

Kargil Sector

5. Ten Pakistani troops were seen improving defences in an area ten miles north-west of Kargil on 3 December 1965.

Uri Sector

6. Pakistani troops were seen laying mines and digging in areas four and three quarter miles south and six and three quarter miles south-south-west of Haji Pir Pass on 30 November 1965 respectively.

7. Pakistani troops were seen constructing bunkers at two places in an area eight miles west-north-west and four and a half miles south-south-west of Haji Pir Pass on 1 December 1965.

8. Pakistani troops were seen improving defences in an area three to four miles south-south-west of Haji Pir Pass on 2 December 1965.

9. Fifteen Pakistani troops were seen digging trenches in an area four miles west-south-west of Haji Pir Pass and a section was seen wiring in an area five and a half miles south of it on 3 December 1965.

10. Pakistani troops were observed constructing bunkers at two places in an area four miles west-south-west and south-south-west of Haji Pir Pass on 4 December 1965.

11. A Pakistani patrol of a section strong approached our position in an area five miles south of Haji Pir Pass on 4 December 1965. On being warned by our troops, they withdrew.

Punch Sector

12. Pakistani troops were seen digging in an area five miles north-west, four and a three quarter miles west-north-west and at two places seven and three quarter miles south-west of Punch on 30 November 1965.

13. Pakistani troops were observed digging in the following areas on 1 December 1965:

- (a) Four and three quarter miles north-west of Punch;
- (b) Seven miles and seven and a half miles south-west of Punch.

14. Pakistani troops fired medium machine-guns towards our post in an area five miles west of Punch on 1 December 1965.

15. Pakistani troops were seen improving defences in an area four and three quarter miles north-west to seven miles south-west of Punch on 2 December 1965.

16. Pakistani troops fired Browning machine-guns towards our post in an area six and a half miles west-south-west of Punch on 3 December 1965.

17. Thirty Pakistani troops were seen constructing bunkers in an area five miles west-north-west of Punch on 4 December 1965.

18. Pakistani troops fired towards our posts on 30 November 1965 and the night of 30 November and 1 December 1965 as under:

- (A) Thirty rounds 25-pounders in an area, nine miles north-west of Mendhar.
- (B) Thirty-five rounds 81 mm mortars and twenty rounds 3.7-inch Howitzers and 25-pounders in an area five and a half miles west of Mendhar.
- (C) Twenty-five rounds of 3.7-inch Howitzer and fifteen rounds of 81 mm mortars at three posts in areas between five and a quarter miles and four miles west-south-west of Mendhar.

19. Two Pakistani jet aircraft flew over an area six miles north-north-west of Mendhar approximately 10,000 feet at 1105 hours on 1 December 1965.

20. Pakistani troops fired as under on 1 December and the night of 1/2 December 1965:

- (A) 25-pounders, 3-inch and 81 mm mortars towards three of our posts in Balnoi area, approximately eight miles west-north-west of Mendhar.
- (B) 3.7-inch Howitzers towards an area five miles west-north-west of Galuthi.
- (C) 3.7-inch Howitzers towards our post in an area three and a half miles south-west of Galuthi.
- (D) Rifles and medium machine-guns towards our post in an area four miles west-south-west of Mendhar.
- (E) Medium machine-guns and 81 mm mortars towards two of our posts in an area six miles south-south-west and seven miles south-west of Galuthi.

21. Three Pakistani troops were observed carrying ballies on our side of the cease-fire line in an area four and a half miles south-west of Galuthi on 1 December 1965.

Mendhar Sector

22. Pakistani troops were seen digging and improving defences in an area four and one quarter miles north-north-west to five and three quarter miles north-north-west of Balnoi on 2 December 1965.

23. Some Pakistani troops were collecting ballies and digging in areas four and one quarter miles west-south-west and three and a half miles south-west of Galuthi on 3 December 1965.

24. Some Pakistani troops were seen entering houses in an area three and a half miles south-south-west of Mendhar on 2 December 1965.

25. Pakistani troops directed light machine-gun and 81 mm mortar fire towards our posts in areas five miles south-south-east of Balnoi and two and three quarter miles south-south-east of Mendhar on 3 December 1965.

26. Pakistani troops fired on our posts on 3 December 1965 as under:

- (A) Thirty-five rounds of medium machine-gun, 113 rounds of 25-pounders, 134 rounds of 3.7 inch Howitzer and 168 rounds of 81 mm 3-inch mortar in areas eight to nine miles west-north-west, four to seven miles west-south-west and approximately six miles south-south-east of Mendhar.
- (B) Twenty-two rounds of 3.7-inch Howitzer and a few rounds of 81 mm mortar in areas five and a half miles west-north-west and five miles south-west of Galuthi.

27. Pakistani troops fired 25-pounders, 3.7-inch Howitzers and 81 mm mortars towards three of our posts in an area six miles west-south-west of Mendhar on 5 December 1965.

Naushahra Sector

28. Twelve Pakistani troops fired 2-inch mortar, medium machine-guns and light machine-guns on our post in an area five miles west-south-west of Naushahra on 30 November 1965.

29. Five Pakistani troops intruded in our area, approximately three and a half miles south-south-east of Jhangar on 1 December 1965.

30. Some Pakistani troops were seen constructing bunkers in an area five miles north-east of Jhangar on 2 December 1965.

31. Pakistani troops directed small arms and artillery fire towards five of our posts in an area two and a quarter miles north-north-west to five miles east-north-east of Jhangar and five miles west-south-west of Naushahra on 2 December 1965.

32. Pakistani troops fired 290 rounds of 25-pounders and a few rounds of 81 mm mortar in areas approximately seven miles north-east and two and half miles north and north-east of Jhangar on 3 December 1965.

33. Five Pakistani troops intruded on our side of the cease-fire line in an area three and half miles south-south-east of Jhangar on 4 December 1965. On being warned by our troops they withdrew.

34. One new bunker each was observed in an area two and a half miles north-west and two and three quarter miles north-west of Jhangar on 5 December 1965.

Akhnur Sector

35. Two Pakistani F-86 aircraft flew on visual reconnaissance mission between 1110 to 1118 hours on 1 December 1965.

36. Pakistani troops fired two light machine-gun bursts from an area three miles east-south-east of Kalidhar on the night of 30 November and 1 December 1965.

37. Pakistani troops were seen improving defences on 1 December 1965 as under:

- (A) Digging in areas five and a half miles west, two and a half miles south-west and three and a half miles west-south-west of Kalidhar.
- (B) Improving trenches in an area four and a half miles north-north-east of Kalit, constructing bunkers and digging trenches at two places in general area six and a half miles west of Akhnur.

38. Pakistani troops were observed strengthening defences at four places in an area between nine miles east-south-east and seven and a half miles south-south-east of Kalidhar on 1/2 December 1965.

39. Pakistani troops were observed constructing bunkers at two places in areas three and a half miles north-east and four and a half miles north-north-east of Jaurian on 1 and 2 December 1965, respectively.

40. Four Pakistani troops were seen digging in an area six miles north-north-west of Dewa on 2 December 1965.

41. Pakistani troops fired one rifle shot at our position in an area four and a half miles east and one rifle grenade four and a quarter miles east of Kalidhar on 2 December 1965.

42. Pakistani troops were seen digging in the following areas on 3 December 1965:

- (A) Ten men in an area four miles north-east of Jaurian.
- (B) Sixteen men in an area five and three quarter miles south-east of Kalit.
- (C) Six men in an area five and a half miles north-east of Kalit.
- (D) Eight men in an area three and three quarter miles east-north-east of Jaurian.

43. Pakistani troops were seen digging at four places in an area between four and three quarter miles east and six and a half miles north of Kalit and in an area approximately three miles west-south-west of Kalidhar on 3 and 4 December 1965 respectively.

44. Noise of dumping of defence stores was heard in an area one and three quarter miles south-east of Kalidhar on 4 December 1965.

45. Pakistani troops fired medium machine-guns on our positions in an area four miles east-north-east of Jaurian on 4 December 1965.

46. Pakistani troops were observed strengthening defences at eight places in an area between five miles east-north-east and six and a half miles north of Kalit on 4 and 5 December 1965.

47. Pakistani troops were observed digging at two places in an area five miles west-south-west and six miles west of Kalidhar on 5 December 1965.

48. Six Pakistani troops were observed constructing bunkers in an area six miles north-north-west of Dewa on 5 December 1965.

Sialkot Area

49. Pakistani troops fired one light machine-gun burst from Hut area, three and three quarter miles west of Phillora on our other ranks going towards observation post in an area three and a half miles west-north-west of Phillora on 1 December 1965. Pakistan United Nations Representative visited that area. They again fired two rifle shots in the presence of the United Nations Representative.

50. Pakistani air observation aircraft flew from the direction of Chawinda towards Fathepur, three and a half miles north-west of Chawinda on 1 December 1965. On being warned by our troops, they fired with medium machine-guns on our observation post in an area two and a half miles west-south-west of Phillora.

51. Seven Pakistani troops were seen digging in an area approximately three miles west-south-west of Phillora at 1115 hours on 2 December 1965.

Lahore Sector

52. One Pakistani air observation post aircraft flew over Gobindpura and an area 7597 west to east between 1900 to 2000 on 30 November 1965.

53. One Pakistani jet aircraft flew over general area Ehasin, Dograi and 1,000 yards south-east of Jallo at 1100 hours on 1 December 1965. It approached from north-west and flew away towards south-west.

54. Pakistani troops fired sixteen rifle shots from two places in Bhasin area and three bursts of Browning machine-gun on our observation post from an area 900 yards north-west of Bhasin on 30 November 1965.

55. Pakistani troops fired 200 rounds of small arms from an area two miles south-south-west of Barki on 30 November 1965 and a few rifle shots towards our troops in an area 800 yards south-south-west of Barki on 1 December 1965.

56. Pakistani troops were seen strengthening bunkers in an area 1,200 yards north-north-west of Dograi, 1,600 yards south, 1,400 yards and one mile south-west of Bhasin on 30 November 1965. They were also seen digging trenches in areas 1,500 yards south and one mile south-south-west of Bhasin on 30 November and 1 December 1965 respectively.

57. Pakistani troops fired one rifle shot each, twice from Dograi area and once from Bhasin area towards our troops on 1 December 1965.

58. Pakistani troops fired two medium machine-gun bursts on our positions in an area one and three quarter miles south-south-west of Barki on 1 December 1965.

59. Eight Pakistani troops intruded into an area 1,000 yards west-north-west of Jhaman on 1 December 1965 and opened fire with light machine-guns when warned. Afterwards, they went back.

60. Pakistani troops fired eleven tank shells and three rounds of recoilless gun towards our troops in an area two and a half miles and one mile south-south-west of Barki respectively on 1 December 1965.

61. Three Pakistani tanks came from Lahore direction to Barki Bridge on 1 December 1965.

62. Pakistani troops fired one rifle shot each on three of our observation posts and were observed strengthening defences at two places in an area between Dograi and two miles north of it on 2 December 1965.

63. Pakistani troops fired one rifle shot on our observation post in an area one and three quarter miles west-south-west of Manihala on 3 December 1965.

64. Pakistani troops directed small arms fire towards our posts in an area approximately one mile south-south-west of Barki and three and a half miles north-north-west of Jhaman on 2 December 1965.

65. Pakistani troops directed small arms fire towards four of our posts in an area 400 yards north-north-west to one mile south-south-east of Bhasin, two of our

posts in an area one and a quarter miles north of Dograi and an area three and a quarter miles south of Barki on 2 and 3 December 1965.

66. Some Pakistani troops were seen digging in areas 100 yards west-north-west to one and a quarter miles south-south-west of Bhasin on 3 December 1965.

67. Eight Pakistani troops each were seen digging in areas half a mile and one and a quarter miles north-north-west of Dograi on 3 December 1965.

68. Pakistani troops infiltrated three quarters of a mile west-south-west of Jhaman at 1400 hours on 3 December 1965 but went back on being warned.

69. Pakistani troops were seen constructing bunkers in an area 200 yards west of Syphon on 3 December 1965.

70. Some Pakistani troops were seen digging in an area two and three quarter miles north-north-west of Jhaman on the east bank of Ichhogil Canal at 1500 hours on 3 December 1965. They opened light machine-gun fire when warned by our troops and afterwards they moved to the west bank of the Canal on the night of 3/4 December 1965.

71. Approximately forty Pakistani troops were seen moving up in extended line in an area two and three quarter miles north-north-west of Khem Karan at 2300 hours on 3 December 1965. They advanced through their minefield towards our posts and came up to seventy yards of our troops. On being warned by our troops, they withdrew and fired with small arms and 2-inch mortars from 2310 hours on 3 December 1965, to 0330 hours on 4 December 1965.

72. Pakistani troops fired rifle shots towards our troops in an area 400 yards to one mile north-north-west of Dograi, three times on 3 December 1965 and once on 4 December 1965. They also fired a rifle shot each on our positions in Bhasin and Barki areas.

73. Pakistani troops were seen digging in an area 1,300 yards south-south-west of Bhasin on 3 and 4 December 1965, 350 yards north of Bhasin and 800 yards west-north-west of Dograi on 4 December 1965.

74. Pakistani troops fired five light machine-gun shots and thirteen rifle shots towards our troops in an area three and a quarter miles south-south-west and 1,000 yards south-west of Barki respectively, on 4 December 1965.

75. Pakistani troops fired a few rifle and light machine-gun shots towards three of our positions in an area between one mile south-south-west and three miles south of Barki on 4/5 December 1965.

76. Pakistani troops fired rifles, light and medium machine-guns towards seven of our posts in an area between Dograi and Bhasin on 4 and 5 December 1965.

77. Pakistani troops were observed strengthening defences at four places in an area between Bhasin and two miles north-west of Manihala on 4 and 5 December 1965.

78. Pakistani troops along with some civilians were seen digging in an area two and a half miles north of Dera Baba Nanak at 0930 hours on 5 December 1965.

79. Eight civilian vehicles and two bullock carts were seen being loaded with wooden ballies in village Ramuwal, approximately two miles east-north-east of Khem Karan at 1040 hours on 5 December 1965. It is presumed that the wooden structures were being dismantled from the village for using them as defence stores.

Fazilka Sector

80. Pakistani troops were seen digging in an area four and three quarter miles west-north-west of Fazilka on 30 November 1965, and digging noise was heard from an area four and a quarter miles north-west of it on the night of 29/30 November 1965.

81. Pakistani troops were seen digging in an area one and a quarter miles north-west and one and a half miles north-north-west of Hussainiwala Headworks and constructing bunkers in an area one and a half miles north of it on 30 November 1965.

82. Pakistani troops were seen constructing bunkers in an area 300 yards north of Chananwala on 30 November 1965.

83. Pakistani troops fired four rifle shots, at our observation post, 1,200 yards north-west of Chananwala on 30 November 1965.

84. Pakistani troops fired with small arms towards our post in an area eight miles north-north-west of Jalalabad on 1 December 1965.

85. Pakistani troops fired rifle shots and light machine-gun bursts towards our post in an area five miles south-west of Fazilka on 1 December 1965.

86. Pakistani troops fired two rifle shots each on our post in an area three miles north-west of Natilka on 1 and 2 December 1965.

87. Pakistani troops fired with a light machine-gun towards our post in an area three and a half miles west of Fazilka on 2 December 1965.

88. Pakistani troops directed small arms fire towards four of our posts in an area three and a half miles to ten miles south-south-west of Mamdot, and three of our posts in an area ten miles north to eight and a half miles north-north-west of Jalalabad on 2 December 1965.

89. Pakistani troops were seen digging in an area six miles south-west of Fazilka on 2 December 1965.

90. Pakistani troops directed small arms fire towards our posts in areas three quarters of a mile north-west of Chananwala and Gulshah post, three miles west-north-west of Fazilka on 2 December 1965 and the night of 2/3 December 1965.

91. Pakistani troops threw one grenade towards our position in an area two miles south of Rajoke at 0115 hours on 4 December 1965.

92. A Pakistani air observation post aircraft flew over Muthianwali five miles south-west of Fazilka towards north-west at 1310 hours on 3 December 1965. Another aircraft flew over Pakka, Khokhar and Mahar Sona areas seven miles south-west to five and a half miles north-west of Fazilka on 3 December 1965.

93. Digging noise was heard from an area eight miles north of Jalalabad on the night of 3/4 December 1965.

94. New Pakistani bunkers were observed in an area one and a half miles north of Hussainiwala on 4 December 1965.

95. Four rifle shots were fired on our observation post in an area one mile north-west of Chananwala at 1750 hours on 4 December 1965.

96. Pakistani troops fired small arms towards our police post in an area five and a half miles south-west of Mamdot, from 1750 to 1800 hours on 4 December 1965.

97. Four Pakistani troops were observed constructing bunkers in an area one and a half miles west of Chananwala at 1600 hours on 4 December 1965.

98. Pakistani troops fired five rifle shots towards our police post in an area seven miles north-north-west of Jalalabad at 1000 hours on 5 December 1965.

99. Pakistani troops fired small arms towards our post in an area three miles north-west of Fazilka at 0610 hours on 6 December 1965.

Rajasthan

100. Pakistani troops shelled Nuriyala, six miles south-south-east of Miajlar on 29 November 1965.

101. Pakistani troops fired on our police patrol in an area, point 509, fourteen miles south of Miajlar on 30 November 1965.

102. Pakistani patrol fired on our position at point 473, four miles south-west of Miajlar at 1900 hours on 30 November 1965.
103. Pakistani troops attempted to encircle our patrol by two platoons in an area seven miles south of Miajlar on 1 December 1965.
104. Eight Pakistani personnel were observed making two bunkers in an area nine miles south-south-west of Gadra on 2 December 1965.
105. Pakistani air observation post aircraft and a helicopter flew over our positions in an area Kinara and Vasant Ka Par in areas eight and ten miles south-south-west of Gadra respectively on 1 December 1965.
106. Pakistani air observation aircraft circled over Ghotaru from 1550 to 1605 hours on 2 December 1965 and returned to Langanewala. Another reconnaissance aircraft from the direction of Langanewala flew over Ghantial Ka Mandir and Tanot at 0845 hours on 2 December 1965 and went towards Kishangarh.
107. Ten Pakistani troops were observed making a new section post in an area fourteen miles south of Gadra Road till 1600 hours on 2 December 1965.
108. Pakistani troops directed artillery fire towards our position in Intkan area ten miles south-west of Gadra Road on 3 December 1965.
109. Pakistani troops approximately two companies strong were observed in Sadau area, twenty-four miles north-west of Ramgarh at 1530 hours on 3 December 1965.
110. Pakistani troops, approximately one section, directed small arms fire towards our post from a high ground area, twenty-eight miles west of Ramgarh at 1750 hours on 3 December 1965.
111. Pakistani troops approximately one platoon strong fired at our air observation post at point 413, fourteen miles west-south-west of Gadra Road at 1630 hours on 3 December 1965.
112. Pakistani troops fired on our patrols in general area six miles south-east of Rohari and six miles west-south-west of Miajlar on 3 December 1965.
113. Pakistani troops fired medium machine-guns and small arms on our patrol in an area six miles south-south-west of Miajlar on 4 December 1965.
114. Pakistani air observation aircraft fired at our patrol in an area twenty miles north-west of Gadra Road on 3 December 1965.
115. Pakistani troops fired on our patrol in an area twenty-one miles south-south-west of Miajlar at 0200 hours on 3 December 1965.

116. A light aircraft of Pakistan flew low over Tanot and Ghantial Ka Mandir (four miles south-east of Tanot) on 5 December 1965.

Cease-fire violation complaints have been or are being lodged in respect of all these violations.

I shall be grateful if this communication is circulated as a Security Council document.
