LETTER DATED 12 DECEMBER 1965 FROM THE PERMANENT REPRESENTATIVE OF INDIA
ADDRESSED TO THE SECRETARY-GENERAL

I have the honour to communicate the following further cease-fire violations and other incidents created by Pakistan:

Jammu and Kashmir

Kargil Sector

1. Two explosions were heard in an area, five and a half miles north of Kargil, within 10,000 yards of cease-fire line, at 1130 hours on 5 December 1965.
2. Approximately thirty-five Pakistani troops established a new post on their side of the cease-fire line, eight miles north-north-west of Kargil at 1500 hours on 5 December 1965.
3. Ten Pakistani troops were seen improving defences in an area four and a half miles north-north-east of Kargil on 7 December 1965.

Tithwal Sector

4. Pakistani troops fired medium machine-guns towards our positions in areas six and six and three-quarter miles north-north-east of Tithwal on 6 December 1965.
5. Pakistani troops were observed improving defences on 6 and 7 December 1965, as under:
 - (a) Twenty Pakistani personnel were seen constructing bunkers in an area five and a quarter miles south-south-west of Tithwal.
 - (b) Fifteen Pakistani troops were seen constructing bunkers in an area three and three-quarter miles south-south-east of Tithwal.
 - (c) One section was seen constructing bunkers in an area five miles south-south-west of Tithwal.

Uri Sector

6. Pakistani troops were seen constructing bunkers in areas three and one-quarter miles west-south-west and five miles south of Haji Pir Pass on 5 December 1965.

7. Pakistani troops fired with light and Browning machine-guns and 2-inch mortars at our patrol in an area nine miles west-south-west of Uri on 6 December 1965.

8. Pakistani troops were observed improving defences on 6 and 7 December 1965, as under:

(a) One section was seen constructing bunkers in an area three and three-quarter miles west-south-west of Haji Pir.

(b) Fifteen Pakistani troops were seen constructing bunkers in an area three miles west-south-west of Haji Pir.

(c) One section was seen constructing bunkers in an area four and three-quarter miles south-west of Haji Pir Pass.

9. Sixteen Pakistani troops were seen constructing bunkers in an area eight and a half miles west-north-west of Uri on 7 December 1965.

Funch Sector

10. Pakistani troops directed medium machine-gun fire towards our post in an area four miles west-north-west of Funch at 0935 hours on 6 December 1965.

11. Pakistani troops fired as under on 7 December 1965:

(a) Pakistani troops fired with medium machine-guns on our position in an area four and a half miles west-south-west of Funch.

(b) A Pakistani patrol fired medium machine-guns on our troops in an area four miles west-north-west of Funch.

12. Pakistani troops were seen digging and constructing bunkers at two places in an area seven miles south-west and five and a half miles west-north-west of Funch, from 1600 hours on 6 December to 1050 hours on 7 December 1965.

13. Thirty Pakistani troops were seen digging in an area five and a quarter miles west-north-west, and ten Pakistani troops in an area six and a quarter miles north-west of Funch on 8 December 1965.

Mendhar Sector

14. Pakistani troops directed 81 mm mortar fire towards our posts in areas four to five and three-quarter miles west-south-west of Galuthi on 5 December 1965.

15. Approximately one section of Pakistani troops intruded on our side of the cease-fire line and fired 83 mm rockets and light machine-guns on our position

in an area five and a half miles south-west of Rajauri, at 2230 hours on 6 December 1965.

16. Approximately one section of Pakistani troops intruded on our side of the cease-fire line and fired 83 mm rockets and light machine-guns on our police vehicle in an area two miles north-west of Bhimber Gali, at 2330 hours on 6 December 1965.

17. Pakistani troops fired as under on 7 December 1965:

(a) Two-inch mortar, light and medium machine-guns towards our post in an area seven miles south-west of Galuthi.

(b) Twenty-five pounders towards our post in an area six and a half miles west-north-west of Mendhar.

(c) Three-inch or 81 mm mortar towards five of our posts in an area eight and a half miles west-north-west of Mendhar.

(d) Twenty-five pounders towards our post in an area nine miles west-south-west of Rajauri.

Naushahra Sector

18. Pakistani troops directed artillery fire towards three of our posts in an area two and a half miles north to five and a quarter miles east-north-east of Jhangar on 5 December 1965.

19. Pakistani troops directed fire of 81 mm mortars, field and medium machine-guns towards eight of our pickets in Jhangar area on 7 December 1965.

20. Pakistani troops were seen improving defences and constructing bunkers at four places in an area two and a half miles north-west to four and a quarter miles north-north-east of Jhangar on 8 December 1965.

Akhnur Sector

21. Pakistani troops were seen digging at the following places on 5 and 6 December 1965:

(a) Seven men each in areas five and three-quarter miles west, and four and one-quarter miles south-south-east of Kalidhar.

(b) Fifteen men in an area three miles south of Kalidhar.

(c) Five men in an area three and three-quarter miles east-north-east of Jaurian.

(d) Six men in an area six and a half miles west of Akhnur.

22. Pakistani troops directed small arms fire towards our post from an area four and a quarter miles east-south-east of Kalidhar on 6 December 1965.

23. A Pakistani F-104 aircraft flew in an area south of Jammu between 1309 and 1320 hours on 1 December 1965.

24. A Pakistani F-104 aircraft flew in an area fifteen miles south of Jammu between 1210 and 1215 hours on 4 December 1965.

25. Pakistani troops were observed improving defences on 7 December 1965, as under:

(a) At three places in an area between four miles east-north-east and seven miles north-north-east of Jaurian.

(b) At two places in an area one and a half miles east-south-east and two and a half miles south-south-west of Kalidhar.

26. Pakistani troops fired with rifles towards our posts in an area two miles east-south-east of Kalidhar at 0830 hours on 7 December 1965.

27. Some Pakistani troops were seen digging at three places in an area seven and a quarter miles west-north-west to seven and a half miles west-north-west of Akhnur on 8 December 1965.

28. Two Pakistani jet aircraft flew from the south-west direction over Dugi area, three miles east-south-east of Kalidhar, at a height of approximately 14,000 feet at 1105 hours on 8 December 1965.

Sialkot Sector

29. Pakistani troops established a new observation post on their side of the cease-fire line in an area three and a half miles south-south-west of Suchetgarh at 1150 hours on 6 December 1965. Our officer held a flag meeting with the Pakistani counterpart, who denied the existence of it.

30. Two Pakistani Sabre jets flew from Sialkot direction over an area two miles north-west to one and a half miles south-west of Suchetgarh, and went away towards an area three miles west to three and a half miles south-west of Bajra Garhi at 1050 hours on 7 December 1965.

Lahore Sector

31. Some Pakistani troops were seen digging in areas three quarters of a mile east of Jallo and one mile west-south-west of Ichhogil Uttar on 5 December 1965.

32. Pakistani troops were seen digging new trenches in an area west of Syphon two and a half miles south-south-west of Barki on 5 December 1965.

33. Noise of digging was heard in an area 1,000 yards north of Dograi on the night of 5/6 December 1965.

34. Pakistani troops directed medium machine-gun fire towards our posts in areas one and three-quarter miles south-south-west and two and a quarter miles south of Barki on 5 and 6 December 1965.

35. Pakistani troops fired one rifle shot at our post in an area one mile west-south-west of Ichhogil Uttar, and rifle, light and Browning machine-guns and 2-inch mortar fire at three of our posts in an area one and a half miles north to half a mile north-east of Dograi on 5 and 6 December 1965.

36. Six Pakistani troops were seen digging in an area one mile south-south-west, and twelve men in an area 500 yards south-south-east of Bhasin, on 5 and 6 December 1965.

37. Pakistani troops directed small arms and 2-inch mortar fire towards three of our posts in an area half a mile north-north-east to one mile south-south-east of Bhasin on 6 December 1965.

38. Pakistani troops fired one rifle shot towards our post in an area one and a quarter miles south-south-east of Barki, at 2210 hours on 6 December 1965.

39. Pakistani troops were observed digging trenches and making bunkers at two places in general area four miles west-north-west of Dera Baba Nanak on 7 December 1965.

40. Pakistani troops fired two rifle shots towards our positions in an area three miles south-south-west of Barki on 7 December 1965.

41. Pakistani troops fired as under on 7 December 1965:

(a) One rifle shot on our post in an area 200 yards west-north-west of Dograi.

(b) One rifle shot on our post east of Bhasin.

(c) Four rifle shots on our post in an area one and a quarter miles south-south-west of Bhasin.

(d) One 3-inch mortar bomb, rifle and light machine-guns towards our positions in an area one mile north of Dograi on 7 December 1965.

42. Six 3-ton vehicles were observed unloading defence stores in Dogaich village approximately two miles north of Dograi, at 0825 hours on 7 December 1965.

43. Some boxes, presumably containing mines, were seen being unloaded from a jeep in an area two and a half miles south-west of Manhiala on 7 December 1965.

44. One 3-ton vehicle carrying approximately fifteen Pakistani troops came to an area three miles south-south-west of Barki on 7 December 1965.

45. Three Pakistani F-86 aircraft flew over our forward position in Khem Karan sector between 1515 and 1525 hours on 22 November 1965.

46. Two Pakistani F-86 aircrafts flew from north to south over Ranian, Bhasin and Dograi at 1105 hours on 7 December 1965.

47. One Pakistani jet aircraft flew over our positions from north to south in an area west of Hudiara on 7 December 1965.

48. Four Pakistani troops were seen digging in area one mile north-west of Haman on 7 December 1965.

49. A Pakistani air observation post aircraft flew from north to south towards Bedian on 7 December 1965.

50. Four Pakistani troops were seen digging in an area one and a quarter miles north-west of Jhaman on 7 December 1965.

51. Approximately one Pakistani section was seen laying mines in an area three quarters of a mile south of Jhaman on 7 December 1965.

52. Pakistani troops fired two bursts with light and medium machine-guns at our position in an area two miles south of Barkil on 8 December 1965.

53. Noise of light machine-gun fire was heard from an area south of Machhike from 0930 hours to 1030 hours on 8 December 1965.

54. Pakistani troops directed small arms and Browning machine-gun fire towards seven of our posts between an area three quarters of a mile south-south-east of Bhasin and one and a half miles west-south-west of Manhiala on 8 December 1965.

Fazilka Sector

55. Pakistani troops directed small arms fire towards our posts in areas three and three-quarter miles west-north-west to five and a quarter miles west-south-west of Mamdot on 5 December 1965.

56. Pakistani troops directed small arms fire towards our post in an area eight and a half miles north of Jalalabad on the night of 5/6 December 1965.

57. Four Pakistani troops were seen constructing a fresh bunker in an area one and three-quarter miles west-north-west of Manhiala on 6 December 1965.

58. Village Muthian Kartar Wali, six miles south-west of Fazilka, was seen on fire between 0920 and 1220 hours on 6 December 1965.

59. One Pakistani observation post aircraft flew from south to north along the line of actual control, approximately 1,000 yards on Indian side, between 1730 and 1745 hours on 27 November 1965.

60. Pakistani troops directed small arms fire as under on 5 and 6 December 1965:

(a) Towards our patrol in an area four miles west of Mamdot.

(b) Towards our posts in areas seven and eight and three-quarter miles south-south-west of Mamdot.

(c) Towards our posts in areas seven and eight and a quarter miles north-north-west of Jalalabad.

61. Pakistani troops were seen laying mines and digging in an area two miles south-west and three miles south-west of Rajoke respectively on 7 December 1965.

62. Pakistani troops fired six rifle shots towards our position in an area north of Ferozepore Headworks at 2005 hours on 7 December 1965.

63. Pakistani troops fired six rifle shots at our post in an area two miles north-west of Husainiwala on 7 December 1965.

64. Pakistani troops constructed a stone wall approximately 40 yards and 3 feet high in an area one mile north-north-east of Ferozepore Headworks on the night of 7/8 December 1965.

65. Pakistani troops fired a few rifle shots at our post in an area Tindiwala, four miles north-north-east of Hussainiwala on 8 December 1965.

66. Pakistani troops fired two light machine-gun bursts and a few rifle shots at our post in an area three miles north-north-west of Mamdot, on 8 December 1965.

Rajasthan

67. A Pakistani observation post fired at our officer on patrol in Makkario area, fourteen miles south of Gadra Road at 1430 hours on 6 December 1965. On being warned by our troops, they ran back towards Makkario. Our patrol was also fired upon with automatics from Makkario.

68. Pakistani troops established a post in an area twenty-six miles south-west of Chohtan on 5 December 1965. Two to three bunkers are reported to be on our side of the border.

69. Our patrol was fired upon by the Pakistani troops in an area sixteen miles south of Gadra on 6 December 1965.

70. Pakistani patrol fired at our listening post in an area nineteen miles west-north-west of Gadra at 2020 hours on 6 December 1965.

71. A Pakistani air observation post aircraft flew twice over our positions in an area Jathir Tibba, twenty-eight miles south-west of Ramgarh at 1015 hours on 8 December 1965.

72. One Pakistani light aircraft came from Longanewala direction, Ghotaru, and flew over our troops in an area Jathir Tibba and Asu Tar approximately twenty-six miles south-west of Ramgarh at 1350 hours on 6 December 1965.

73. Pakistani air observation post aircraft came from the direction of Sadhewala and flew over Tanot at 1300 hours on 7 December 1965.

74. Our patrol observed one Pakistani platoon at point 509, fourteen miles south of Miajlar at 0900 hours on 8 December 1965.

Cease-fire violation complaints have been or are being lodged in respect of all these violations.

I shall be grateful if this communication is circulated as a Security Council document.
