Report of the Fifth Committee

1. At its 34th and 36th meetings, on 20 and 23 December 2005, the Fifth Committee, pursuant to rule 153 of the rules of procedure of the General Assembly, considered the statement by the Secretary-General (A/C.5/60/23) on the programme budget implications of draft resolution A/C.2/60/L.62 as orally revised. At the 34th meeting, the Chairman of the Advisory Committee on Administrative and Budgetary Questions introduced the related report of that Committee (A/60/7/Add.28). The draft decision submitted by the Chairman following informal consultations was before the Committee (see para. 3).

2. The statements and comments made in the course of the Fifth Committee's consideration of this question are reflected in the relevant summary records (A/C.5/60/SR.34 and 36).

Decision of the Fifth Committee

3. The Fifth Committee, having considered the statement of programme budget implications submitted by the Secretary-General¹ and the related report of the Advisory Committee on Administrative and Budgetary Questions,² decides to

inform the General Assembly that should it adopt draft resolution A/C.2/60/L.62, as orally revised, additional requirements in the amount of \$55,200 (\$44,800 under section 2 and \$10,400 under section 28D of the proposed programme budget for the biennium 2006-2007) for the holding of four round tables proposed by the Secretary-General should be absorbed from within the provisions in the proposed programme budget for the biennium 2006-2007, under the respective sections.
