### NOTE BY THE SECRETARY-GENERAL

1. **At** the 75th plenary meeting of its forty-third session, on 8 December 1988, the General Assembly adopted resolution **43/92**, entitled "Adverse consequences for the enjoyment of human rights of political, military, economic and other forms **of** assistance given to the racist and colonialist **régime** of South Africa". **1/**

2. In paragraph 5 of the resolution, the General Assembly:

"**Requests** the Security Council once again urgently to consider the imposition **of** comprehensive and mandatory sanctions under Chapter VII of the Charter of the **United Nations** against the racist **régime** of South Africa, in particular:

"**(a)** The prohibition of all technological assistance or **collaboration** in the manufacture of **arms** and military supplies in South Africa;

"**(b)** The cessation of all collaboration with South Africa in the nuclear **field**;

"**(c)** The prohibition of all **loans** to, and all investments in, South **Africa** and the cessation of any trade with South **Africa**;

"**(d)** An embargo on the supply of petroleum, petroleum products and other strategic goods to South Africa."
