**Statement of the Ministry of Foreign Affairs of Georgia**

12 March 2007

On 11 March 2007, at about 22.10, villages of Upper Abkhazia came under fire by military helicopters that, as preliminary information indicates, crossed Georgia's state border with the Russian Federation from the north.

The shelling caused damage to the office of the Government of the Autonomous Republic of Abkhazia, a school and police buildings stationed in the village of Chkhalta, as well as the local infrastructure, especially in the villages of Azhara, Kvabchara and Ptishi. No casualties were reported.

Within one hour of the incident, the Georgian side notified immediately and demanded explanations from the Ambassador Extraordinary and Plenipotentiary of the Russian Federation to Georgia and the Ministry of Foreign Affairs of the Russian Federation in Moscow. The Office of the State Minister of Georgia for Conflict Resolution contacted the Abkhazian side for appropriate explanations. Information was transmitted to the United Nations Observer Mission in Georgia and the partner countries.

The Ministry of Foreign Affairs of Georgia condemns this act as aiming at hindering the stabilization and reconstruction processes having developed actively in Upper Abkhazia in the recent period and at escalating tension in the region, as well as being directed against peaceful resolution of the conflict.

The Georgian side expects immediate action to be taken by the United Nations Observer Mission and insists that the incident be thoroughly investigated and appropriate conclusions provided in the shortest possible period.

The Ministry of Foreign Affairs of Georgia expects the Russian side to give its own explanations concerning the incident.
