**Review of logical frameworks for special political missions
for the period from 1 January to 31 December 2007**

Report of the Secretary-General

Summary

Pursuant to paragraph 7, section VII, of General Assembly resolution 61/252, the present report contains the review of logical frameworks for special political missions for the period from 1 January to 31 December 2007 presented in the reports of the Secretary-General on estimates in respect of special political missions, good offices and other political initiatives authorized by the General Assembly and/or the Security Council (A/61/525 and Add.1-5).

I. Background

1. In paragraph 7, section VII, of its resolution 61/252, the General Assembly requested the Secretary-General to review the logical frameworks for all special political missions in order to ensure that their programmatic aspects and resource requirements are consistent with mandates of the Assembly and the Security Council and to report to it no later than the early part of the second part of its resumed sixty-first session.
2. Pursuant to that request, logical frameworks of all special political missions for the period from 1 January to 31 December 2007, as presented in the results-based budgeting format and contained in the reports of the Secretary-General on estimates in respect of special political missions, good offices and other political initiatives authorized by the General Assembly and/or the Security Council,¹ have been reviewed, taking into account the provisions set out in section VII of resolution 61/252.
3. As a result, it has been determined that logical frameworks of all but three special political missions are in full compliance with the relevant provisions of the resolution and that its programmatic aspects and resource requirements are consistent with the mandates of the General Assembly and the Security Council.
4. Minor adjustments have been made to the logical framework for the Special Envoy of the Secretary-General for the implementation of Security Council resolution 1559 (2004) and two outputs have been added to the logical frameworks for the United Nations Peacebuilding Support Office in the Central African Republic and the United Nations Peacebuilding Support Office in Guinea-Bissau.
5. The proposed changes to the logical frameworks of these three missions are included in section II below.

II. Revisions to logical frameworks

A. Special Envoy of the Secretary-General for the implementation of Security Council resolution 1559 (2004)

Objective: Full implementation of Security Council resolution 1559 (2004) and all subsequent related decisions of the Council, in particular resolution 1680 (2006) and the relevant provisions of resolution 1701 (2006)

Expected accomplishments

(a) Facilitation of strict respect for the sovereignty, territorial integrity, unity and political independence of Lebanon under the sole and exclusive authority of the Government of Lebanon throughout its territory

Indicators of achievement

(a) (i) Encouragement by the Special Envoy for increased efforts towards the establishment of mutual diplomatic relations between Lebanon and the Member States mentioned in Security Council resolutions 1559 (2004) and 1680 (2006); related statements of the President of the Security Council; and the delineation of the international boundaries of Lebanon with those Member States, bearing in mind that the establishment of diplomatic relations between States, and of permanent diplomatic missions, takes place by mutual consent

 - Regularization and clarification of Lebanon's borders
 - Semi-annual reports of the Secretary-General to the Security Council
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B. United Nations Peacebuilding Support Office in the Central African Republic and United Nations Peacebuilding Support Office in Guinea-Bissau

6. The following outputs will be added under expected accomplishments/indicators of achievement (c) for the United Nations Peacebuilding Support Office in the Central African Republic and under expected accomplishments/indicators of achievement (d) for the United Nations Peacebuilding Support Office in Guinea-Bissau:

- Promotion and monitoring of the implementation of Security Council resolution 1325 (2000) on women and peace and security and the provision of reports on its implementation, aiming at the empowerment of women at the decision-making level in all areas of the peace consolidation process
- Seminar on sensitization of political leaders and civil society actors on the role of women in the peace consolidation process.

III. Action required of the General Assembly

7. **The General Assembly is requested to approve the proposed revisions to the logical framework for the period from 1 January to 31 December 2007 for the Special Envoy of the Secretary-General for the implementation of Security Council resolution 1559 (2004), the United Nations Peacebuilding Support Office in the Central African Republic and the United Nations Peacebuilding Support Office in Guinea-Bissau.**
