Summary statement by the Secretary-General on matters of which the Security Council is seized and on the stage reached in their consideration

Addendum

Pursuant to rule 11 of the provisional rules of procedure of the Security Council, the Secretary-General is submitting the following summary statement.

The list of items of which the Security Council is seized is contained in documents S/2007/10 of 9 February 2007, S/2007/10/Add.7 of 2 March 2007, S/2007/10/Add.12 of 5 April 2007, S/2007/10/Add.15 of 27 April 2007 and S/2007/10/Add.20 of 1 June 2007.

During the week ending 9 June 2007, the Security Council took action on the following items:

Reports of the Secretary-General on the Sudan (*see* S/2004/20/Add.23, 30, 35, 37, 39, 40, 44, 46 and 49; S/2005/15/Add.1, 4-6, 9-12, 18, 25, 28, 30, 37, 40, 49 and 50; S/2006/10/Add.1, 4, 11, 12, 14-16, 18, 19, 23, 34, 36-39, 49 and 50; and S/2007/10/Add.17 and 20)

The Security Council resumed its consideration of the item at its 5687th and 5688th (private) meetings, held on 7 June 2007 in accordance with the understanding reached in its prior consultations.

At the 5687th meeting, in accordance with the understanding reached in the Council's prior consultations, the President, with the consent of the Council, extended an invitation under rule 39 of the Council's provisional rules of procedure to Luis Moreno-Ocampo, Prosecutor of the International Criminal Court.

At the close of the 5688th meeting, in accordance with rule 55 of the provisional rules of procedure of the Security Council, the following communiqué was issued through the Secretary-General in place of a verbatim record:

At its 5688th meeting, held in private on 7 June 2007, the Security Council considered the item entitled "Reports of the Secretary-General on the Sudan".

In accordance with the decision taken at the 5687th meeting held earlier on 7 June 2007, the President extended an invitation under rule 39 of the Council's provisional rules of procedure to Luis Moreno-Ocampo, Prosecutor of the International Criminal Court.



The members of the Council and Luis Moreno-Ocampo had an exchange of views.

Meeting of the Security Council with the troop-contributing countries to the United Nations Peacekeeping Force in Cyprus pursuant to resolution 1353 (2001), annex II, sections A and B (*see* S/2001/15/Add.49; S/2002/30/Add.22 and 46; S/2003/40/Add.22 and 46; S/2004/20/Add.23 and 40; S/2005/15/Add.22 and 48; and S/2006/10/Add.21 and 48)

The Security Council resumed its consideration of the item at its 5689th (private) meeting, held on 8 June 2007 in accordance with the understanding reached in its prior consultations.

At the close of the meeting, in accordance with rule 55 of the provisional rules of procedure of the Security Council, the following communiqué was issued through the Secretary-General in place of a verbatim record:

On 8 June 2007, the Security Council, pursuant to annex II, sections A and B, of resolution 1353 (2001), held its 5689th meeting in private with the troop-contributing countries to the United Nations Peacekeeping Force in Cyprus.

The Security Council and the troop-contributing countries heard a briefing under rule 39 of its provisional rules of procedure by Michael Møller, Special Representative of the Secretary-General for Cyprus and Head of the United Nations Peacekeeping Force in Cyprus.

The members of the Council, Mr. Møller and representatives of participating troop-contributing countries had an exchange of views.

The Security Council resumed its consideration of the item at its 5690th meeting, held on 8 June 2007 in accordance with the understanding reached in its prior consultations.

The President, with the consent of the Council, invited the representatives of Canada, Germany, the Netherlands, Nigeria and Sierra Leone, at their request, to participate in the consideration of the item without the right to vote.

In accordance with the understanding reached in the Council's prior consultations, the President, with the consent of the Council, extended an invitation under rule 39 of the Council's provisional rules of procedure to Justice George Gelaga King, President of the Special Court for Sierra Leone, and Stephen Rapp, Prosecutor of the Special Court for Sierra Leone.
