**Statement of the Royal Government of Cambodia on the  
implementation of Security Council resolution 1737 (2006)**

The Ministry of Foreign Affairs and International Cooperation of the Kingdom of Cambodia presents its compliments to the Security Council Committee established pursuant to resolution 1737 (2006) and, in accordance with paragraph 19 of the resolution, has the honour to communicate the following:

The Royal Government of the Kingdom of Cambodia has instructed all national authorities concerned, especially of the newly established National Chemical Weapon Authority and National Committee on Counter-terrorism, to coordinate their activities in order to take actions in full compliance with the provisions of Security Council resolution 1737 (2006), particularly paragraphs 3, 4, 5, 6, 7, 8, 10, 12 and 17 of the said resolution.

Additionally, the Royal Government of Cambodia will consider taking further necessary steps and measures to ensure the appropriate implementation of the resolution upon receiving the relevant lists of items, material, equipment, goods and technology, determined by the Security Council Committee established pursuant to resolution 1737 (2006), that could contribute to enrichment-related reprocessing or heavy water-related activities, or to the development of nuclear weapon delivery systems.
