



## Security Council

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### **Summary statement by the Secretary-General on matters of which the Security Council is seized and on the stage reached in their consideration**

#### **Addendum**

Pursuant to rule 11 of the provisional rules of procedure of the Security Council, the Secretary-General is submitting the following summary statement.

During the week ending 20 October 2007, the Security Council took action on the following items:

The Security Council resumed its consideration of the item at its 5758th meeting, held on 15 October 2007 in accordance with the understanding reached in its prior consultations, having before it the report of the Secretary-General on the United Nations Stabilization Mission in Haiti (S/2007/503).

The President, with the consent of the Council, invited the representatives of Argentina, Brazil, Canada, Chile, Ecuador, Guatemala, Haiti, Spain and Uruguay, at their request, to participate in the consideration of the item without the right to vote.

The President drew attention to a draft resolution (S/2007/601) submitted by Argentina, Belgium, Brazil, Canada, Chile, Ecuador, France, Guatemala, Italy, Panama, Peru, Spain, Uruguay and the United States of America.

The Security Council proceeded to vote on draft resolution S/2007/601, and adopted it unanimously as resolution 1780 (2007) (for the text, see S/RES/1780 (2007); to be issued in *Official Records of the Security Council, Resolutions and Decisions of the Security Council, 1 August 2007-31 July 2008*).

The Security Council resumed its consideration of the item at its 5759th meeting, held on 15 October 2007 in accordance with the understanding reached in its prior consultations, having before it the report of the Secretary-General on the situation in Abkhazia, Georgia (S/2007/588).

The President, with the consent of the Council, invited the representative of Germany, at his request, to participate in the consideration of the item without the right to vote.

The President drew attention to a draft resolution (S/2007/603) submitted by France, Germany, the Russian Federation, Slovakia, the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Northern Ireland and the United States of America.

The Security Council proceeded to vote on draft resolution S/2007/603, and adopted it unanimously as resolution 1781 (2007) (for the text, see S/RES/1781 (2007); to be issued in *Official Records of the Security Council, Resolutions and Decisions of the Security Council, 1 August 2007-31 July 2008*).

The Security Council resumed its consideration of the item at its 5760th meeting, held on 15 October 2007 in accordance with the understanding reached in its prior consultations, having before it the report of the Secretary-General on the situation in Afghanistan and its implications for international peace and security (S/2007/555).

The President, with the consent of the Council, invited the representatives of Afghanistan, Canada, India, the Islamic Republic of Iran, Japan, the Netherlands, Norway, Pakistan and Portugal, at their request, to participate in the consideration of the item without the right to vote.

In accordance with the understanding reached in the Council's prior consultations, the President, with the consent of the Council, extended an invitation under rule 39 of the Council's provisional rules of procedure to Tom Koenigs, Special Representative of the Secretary-General for Afghanistan and Head of the United Nations Assistance Mission in Afghanistan.

**Post-conflict peacebuilding** (*see* S/2005/15/Add.20 and 50; and S/2007/10/Add.4)

The Security Council resumed its consideration of the item at its 5761st meeting, held on 17 October 2007 in accordance with the understanding reached in its prior consultations, having before it the report of the Peacebuilding Commission on its first session (S/2007/458).

The President, with the consent of the Council, invited the representatives of Burundi, El Salvador, the Netherlands, Norway and Sierra Leone, at their request, to participate in the consideration of the item without the right to vote.

In accordance with the understanding reached in the Council's prior consultations, the President, with the consent of the Council, extended an invitation under rule 39 of the Council's provisional rules of procedure to Yukio Takasu, Chairman of the Peacebuilding Commission.

**The situation in Guinea-Bissau** (*see* S/1998/44/Add.44 and 51; S/1999/25/Add.13; S/2000/40/Add.12 and 47; S/2002/30/Add.27; S/2003/40/Add.24, 39 and 46; S/2004/20/Add.24, 44 and 51; and S/2005/15/Add.12 and 32)

The Security Council resumed its consideration of the item at its 5762nd meeting, held on 19 October 2007 in accordance with the understanding reached in its prior consultations, having before it the report of the Secretary-General on developments in Guinea-Bissau and on the activities of the United Nations Peacebuilding Support Office in that country (S/2007/576).

The President, with the consent of the Council, invited the representative of Guinea-Bissau, at his request, to participate in the consideration of the item without the right to vote.

The President stated that, following consultations of the Council, he had been authorized to make a statement on behalf of the Council and read out the text of that statement (for the text, see S/PRST/2007/38; to be issued in *Official Records of the Security Council, Resolutions and Decisions of the Security Council, 1 August 2007-31 July 2008*).

The President, with the consent of the Council, invited the representative of Iraq, at his request, to participate in the consideration of the item without the right to vote.

In accordance with the understanding reached in the Council's prior consultations, the President, with the consent of the Council, extended an invitation under rule 39 of the Council's provisional rules of procedure to Lynn Pascoe, Under-Secretary-General for Political Affairs.
