The meeting was called to order at 10.15 a.m.

1. **The Chairperson** said she took it that the Commission, in accordance with its established practice, wished to hold an open meeting.

6. **The Chairperson** said that the draft outline of a strategic framework for peacebuilding in Guinea-Bissau was an evolving document. It would be shared with the Government of Guinea-Bissau with a view to seeking the latter's views on it. The Commission's upcoming mission to Guinea-Bissau would provide an opportunity for dialogue aimed at advancing the strategic framework further.
