**Joint evaluation of UNDG contribution to the  
implementation of the Paris Declaration on Aid  
Effectiveness (first phase)**

**Corrigendum**

A new paragraph 1 should be inserted, *to read as follows*:

1. In March 2005, the United Nations Development Group (UNDG) signed as a participating organization the Paris Declaration on Aid Effectiveness together with 91 countries, 25 other participating organizations and 14 civil society organizations.

The remaining paragraphs should be renumbered accordingly.

The first sentence of the new paragraph 2 *should read*:

2. In 2006, the UNDG agreed with partner countries and donors to conduct an evaluation of its contribution to the implementation of the Paris Declaration between 2007 and 2010, using a two-phased approach.

A new paragraph 3 should be inserted, *to read as follows*:

3. Nine countries and 11 development partner organizations volunteered to conduct an evaluation of their own performance under the Paris Declaration as an input into the first-phase evaluation. They agreed to use a common framework for terms of reference, to be adapted to their specific requirements. The countries were Bangladesh, Bolivia, the Philippines, Senegal, South Africa, Sri Lanka, Uganda, Viet Nam and Zambia. The development partners are the Asian Development Bank, Australia, Denmark, Finland, France, Germany, Luxembourg, the Netherlands, New Zealand, the United Kingdom and UNDG.

The remaining paragraphs should be renumbered accordingly.

Footnote 1 *should read*:

<sup>1</sup> Two UNDG member organizations that agreed to carry out the joint assessment are also participating organizations of the Paris Declaration: ECA and IFAD.



The second sentence of the new paragraph 17 *should read*:

This relatively fast response was greatly facilitated by actions that UNDG members had taken prior to the Declaration in line with the direction given by the General Assembly to United Nations operational activities through successive resolutions on the Triennial Comprehensive Policy Review.
