REPORT OF THE OFFICER-IN-CHARGE OF THE UNITED NATIONS
OPERATION IN THE CONGO RELATING TO THE IMPLEMENTATION
OF PARAGRAPH A-2 OF THE SECURITY COUNCIL RESOLUTION
OF 21 FEBRUARY 1961

Addendum covering developments during 21 September 1961

1. By 0000 hours on 21 September 1961 all United Nations troops throughout Katanga had been informed of the cease-fire agreement signed by the United Nations special emissary, Mr. Khiari, and President Tshombe at Ndola, and had received the necessary instructions to implement paragraph (2) of this agreement. The announcement of the cease-fire was also carried on the United Nations-controlled radio station of Elisabethville in French, English and Swahili.
2. Despite the cease-fire there were two shooting incidents in Elisabethville. In one case there was sniping at the refugee camp around 10 a.m. and a few bursts of machine gun fire were directed at the post office at about 1 p.m. Sniping at the refugee camps has resulted in ten refugees being killed and approximately fifty wounded during the past two days.
3. In all other places in Katanga the situation has been reported to be calm.
