Election of a member of the Sub-Commission on
Prevention of Discrimination and Protection of Minorities

Note by the Secretary-General

1. The Secretary-General has been informed that Mr. Jorge Bocobo of the Philippines has resigned as a member of the Sub-Commission on Prevention of Discrimination and Protection of Minorities and that Mr. José D. Ingles has been nominated, with the consent of the Government of the Philippines, for election to the unexpired term of Mr. Bocobo on the Sub-Commission. Mr. Ingles served as Mr. Bocobo's alternate at the sixth and seventh sessions of the Sub-Commission and was elected its Rapporteur. Biographical details concerning him are included in the Annex to this document.
2. In view of the above communication, the Secretary-General has proposed the addition of an item to the provisional agenda of the Commission on Human Rights (E/CN.4/707/Add.1).
3. The composition of the Sub-Commission is governed by the following decision which the Commission took at its first session in 1947 (E/259, para. 20):
 - "(a) That the Sub-Commission be composed of twelve members selected by the Commission in consultation with the Secretary-General and subject to the consent of the governments of which the persons are nationals;
 - (b) That not more than one person be selected from any single country."
4. At its ninth session, the Commission elected twelve members to the Sub-Commission, including Dr. Jorge Bocobo, for a term of office of three years, covering the period 1 January 1954 to 31 December 1956 (see E/2447, paras. 219-225). Elections are governed by rules 62-64 of the Rules of Procedure of the Functional Commissions of the Economic and Social Council.
