Second emergency special session

THE SITUATION IN HUNGARY

Cablegram dated 4 November 1956 from Mr. Janos Kadar, Prime Minister of the Revolutionary Workers and Peasants Government of Hungary and from Mr. Imre Horvath, Minister of Foreign Affairs, addressed to the Secretary-General.

Budapest, 4 November 1956

THE REVOLUTIONARY WORKERS AND PEASANTS GOVERNMENT OF HUNGARY DECLARES THAT IMRE NAGY'S REQUESTS^{1/} TO THE UNITED NATIONS TO HAVE THE HUNGARIAN QUESTION DISCUSSED IN THE UNITED NATIONS HAVE NO LEGAL FORCE AND CANNOT BE CONSIDERED AS REQUESTS EMANATING FROM HUNGARY AS A STATE STOP THE REVOLUTIONARY WORKERS AND PEASANTS GOVERNMENT OBJECTS CATEGORICALLY TO ANY DISCUSSION OF THE SAID QUESTION EITHER BY THE SECURITY COUNCIL OR BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY BECAUSE THAT QUESTION IS WITHIN THE EXCLUSIVE JURISDICTION OF THE HUNGARIAN PEOPLE'S REPUBLIC STOP JANOS KADAR PRIME MINISTER OF THE REVOLUTIONARY WORKERS AND PEASANTS GOVERNMENT OF HUNGARY STOP IMRE HORVATH MINISTER OF FOREIGN AFFAIRS STOP
