ECONOMIC AND SOCIAL COUNCIL (ITEM 11 ON THE AGENDA)

Sir,

I have the honour to refer to the proceedings of the Economic and Social Council at its Fourth Session, during which it appointed a Committee consisting of the President and two of its Members for the purpose of consulting with representatives of the Trusteeship Council regarding arrangements for co-operation in dealing with matters of common concern, and to your own subsequent statement to the Trusteeship Council on this subject in the course of the sixth meeting of the Council on 1 April 1947. The Trusteeship Council will no doubt wish to take this question into preliminary consideration during its current Session in connection with Item 11 on its Agenda, with a view to the appointment of representatives to confer on its behalf with the representatives of the Economic and Social Council.

The date of the next Session of the Economic and Social Council is set for 19 July, and the Session is likely to last approximately four weeks. The Trusteeship Council will doubtless wish to consider the practicability of the proposed consultations being initiated between representatives of the Councils about that time.
