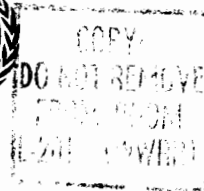

1. The CHAIRMAN invited the Vice-Chairman of the Committee to report on the informal meetings over which he had presided.
2. Mr. GORITZA (Romania) said that a number of delegations had contributed useful ideas during the meetings held from 14 to 19 September in accordance with the Committee's mandate. Consideration had been given to draft resolution A/C.2/31/L.95, submitted by the representative of Pakistan. In spite of the efforts made, the nature and complexity of the problems involved had made it impossible to produce for the Committee, in the short time available, a text which could be adopted by consensus. He wished to thank the Secretary of the Committee and all those who had participated in the informal meetings.
3. The CHAIRMAN said that he sincerely regretted the failure to reach agreement on the draft resolution submitted to the Committee and hoped that during the next session a solution would be achieved which would be to the advantage of all Member States. He wished to thank the Vice-Chairman for his effective and patient work during the informal consultations.

COMPLETION OF THE COMMITTEE'S WORK

4. Mr. QADRUD-DIN (Pakistan), speaking on behalf of the Group of 77, thanked the Chairman for his direction of the work of the Committee at the resumed thirty-first session.
